## DISCUSS

1. Share an adventure you experienced in your life.

2. Pastor Patrick shared the following definition for the word, adventure: "An unusual and exciting, typically hazardous, undertaking." Which part of the definition hits you the hardest? Why?

- 3. Read Mark 1:1. What strikes you about this opening to Mark's account?
- 4. Mark is announcing the arrival of the long awaited good news (i.e. "gospel" What does the arrival of good news suggest? What's the bad news?
- 5. Read Genesis 3:15 and discuss. What is being promised here in vs. 15 in light of the first 14 verses (see also Gen. 2:16-17)?
- 6. Which of the following statements of Jesus brings you the most encouragement tonight, and why?
  - "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (Jn. 3:16).
  - "With man this is impossible, but with God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26).
  - "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (Jn. 14:6).

- "For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light" (Mt. 11:30).
- "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" (Mt. 4:19).
- "As the Father has sent me... So I am sending you" (Jn. 20:21).
- "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few" (Mt. 9:37).
- "I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance" (Lk. 5:32).
- "I am the light of the world" (Jn. 8:12).
- "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ... " (Mt. 28:19).
- "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mk. 15:34).
- "It is finished" (Jn. 19:30).
- 7. How would you summarize God's "undertaking" in and through His Son, Jesus?
- 8. In what ways has Jesus invited us in His adventure? Pastor Patrick said God's "undertaking" has become ours. What does that mean?
- 9. What immediate applications can be made in light of this text?
