“Baggage” | 1 Corinthians 6:9-11, 18-20, John 8:1-11, 2 Peter 2:19

Week 2: Sexual Sin | April 3, 2022

1. ICEBREAKER: What’s something you’re glad you tried but would never do again? (*Leader Tip: this is just a lighter intro question, unrelated to the content. With heavier weeks, it can be wise to start on a lighter note.*)
2. Read 1 Corinthians 6:9-11. How do these verses compare with our current cultural understanding of sex?
 - a. Is the answer different inside the Church? Why or why not?
3. Read v. 11, “But such were some of you.” We often think of what Jesus has saved us *to* (heaven, holiness, church, etc.) but what has Jesus specifically saved you *from*? *Leader Tip: If your group has a member who gave their life to Jesus at a young age and struggles with this question, ask them to consider who they are when they’re living outside of obedience to Jesus? What are their specific sin struggles and what might those things lead them to apart from Jesus?*
4. Read v. 18-19 – how do these verses give a level of dignity to our bodies we often struggle to give ourselves?
 - a. In what ways do you see God giving dignity and worth to his people in a counter-cultural way?
5. Read John 8:1-11, focusing on v.11.
 - a. What sticks out to you most in this story?
 - b. Which of the 2 statements from Jesus in v. 11 do you most need to hear right now?
6. Steven claimed the Church needs to clarify its **position** on sexual sin while also softening the **posture** from which those positions are communicated.
 - a. Do you agree? Why or why not?
 - b. How might these two adjustments change some of your conversations/thoughts around sexual sin?
7. How is week 1’s sermon (shame) related to week 2’s (sexual sin)?
