

## Small Group Questions "Generosity over Hoarding" | Acts 11:27-30, 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 Week 2: January 16, 2022

- 1. What has been your experience (good or bad) with churches talking about money? No need to name specific churches/pastors here.
  - a. Do you think churches should talk about money more or less? Why?
- 2. Did you know? Both of this week's passages (Acts 11 and 2 Cor. 9) were written in the context of local churches raising money to serve their neighbors in Jerusalem during the famine they were also experiencing. I wonder if Paul (wrote 2 Cor.) was inspired by the generosity of the church in Acts.
  - a. Share about a time when someone else's generosity inspired you to be generous?
- 3. Steven said, "Choosing generosity over hoarding starts with choosing trust over worry."
  - a. Do you agree/disagree? Why?
  - b. Why does giving make us nervous sometimes?
  - c. How has giving increased your trust in God?
- 4. Of the 4 biblical giving principles from Acts 11:29-30, which one stands out to you the most?
  - a. Biblical giving is a determined response to God's grace.
  - b. Biblical giving is done according to ability.
  - c. Biblical giving is actually given.
  - d. Biblical giving is to/through the Church.
  - e. Which one do you see the most evidence of in your life?
  - f. Which one do you need to take a step of growth in?
- 5. Read 2 Cor. 9:6-7.
  - a. How have you seen both aspects of v. 6 ring true in your life?
  - b. How do you think we balance the command to give "not reluctantly or under compulsion" with the biblical command to tithe in Malachi 3:10?
- 6. If you as an individual/family were going to take *one practical step* toward living a radically generous life, what would that look like?
  - a. What barriers are you allowing to stand in your way of taking that step?
