From Why to Worship: Trusting God When Life Doesn't Make Sense
10-Week Study of Habakkuk (Week 4)
Habakkuk 2:1-7 | Oct 12, 2025

The theme of Habakkuk is Waiting. Habakkuk is frustrated by God's delay in providing for his people. But as Habakkuk waits, God restores and grows his faith and confidence in God.

OPENER: Have you ever prayed for patience and later wished you had not? What's the danger of that prayer and the corresponding blessing? How has God been teaching you patience? (Or how has he in the past?)

Read Habakkuk 1:1-2:7 (Start from the beginning just for context.)

1. What does Habakkuk mean when he says he will "station myself on the ramparts" in verse 1? How can we apply this concept to our own lives?

NOTE: Watchmen were stationed at the highest part of a city wall to warn of impending danger (see Ezek 33:2–6). As watchmen, prophets were to communicate the divine message to the people (see Jer 6:17; Ezek 3:17–21; Hos 9:8).

2. In verse 2, God instructs Habakkuk to write down the vision and make it plain. Why is it important to write down or document important messages from God? How does this help in our journey of faith? Do you have any experience with that? What have you done?
3. How does Habakkuk demonstrate faith and patience as he waits for God's response in verse 3? How can we cultivate this kind of trust in our own lives? Is there a way we can pray for you in this season of 'faith and patience'?
4. Reflect on the phrase "the righteous shall live by his faith" in verse 4. What does it mean to live by faith, and how can we apply this principle in our daily lives? Is there anything specific you would like to do this week?
5. In verse 5, the message is clear that the proud and arrogant will not endure, but the righteous will live by faith. How can we guard against pride and cultivate humility in our own lives? How does pride and arrogance reveal itself in your life?
6. Discuss the concept of wealth and treasures mentioned in verse 6-7. How does the pursuit of material possessions and wealth compare to the enduring value of trusting in God?

7. How does the ultimate triumph of God's justice and righteousness as outlined in Habakkuk 2:1-7 provide hope and assurance for believers in times of uncertainty and difficulty?
8. Take time to pray as a group. If you have more than 5 people, break into multiple groups to share and pray.
