Title: Who is Jesus?

Speaker: Travis Boyd

Key Scripture: Psalm 110 (with Matthew 22:41–46, Genesis 14:17–20, Hebrews 7, 1 Corinthians 15:25–26)

The Big Idea: We often shrink Jesus into a manageable image that fits our preferences, but Psalm 110 destroys our self-made boxes. As the Reigning King, Perfect Priest, and Victorious Warrior, the real Jesus cannot be managed—He demands our complete surrender.

1. Jesus is the Reigning King

- Psalm 110:1 presents a divine declaration: "The LORD says to my Lord: 'Sit at my right hand.'" Though Jesus is born into David's family tree as "David's Son," David bows to Him as "Lord."
- Authority Over All: Jesus is not King because culture elects Him; He is King because God declared it. He claims total authority over our lives, leaving no room for us to act as "backseat drivers."
- Ruling Midst Opposition: Jesus reigns right now in the middle of a chaotic world. His present rule does not require the immediate absence of enemies.
- Enemies Made Worshippers: Through the cross, the King does not merely crush His enemies—He turns former rebels into willing worshippers.

2. Jesus is the Perfect Priest

- A holy King is terrifying for sinners, but Psalm 110:4 promises a King who is also a "priest forever after the order of Melchizedek."
- Permanent Intercession: Unlike earthly priests who died and had to be replaced, Jesus' priesthood never ends. His sacrifice never expires, and your salvation never changes hands.
- Stopping the Cover-Up: Like children trying to paint over a mess, we often use shame, defensiveness, or self-punishment to try to pay for our sin. Jesus didn't come to help us hide our mess; He offered Himself to clean it completely.
- The Throne of Grace: Because Jesus satisfies the King's holy standards, we can draw near with confidence. Our access to God is secured by Christ's performance, not ours.

3. Jesus is the Victorious Warrior

- Psalm 110 ends with a picture of judgment that no soft, manageable version of Jesus can contain. He is the Warrior who shatters kings, executes judgment, and tramples the serpent beneath His feet.
- Final Justice: Final judgment is good news for the wounded. Evil will not have the last word, and we do not have to spend our lives settling scores because God will make all things right.
- Death Defeated: As 1 Corinthians 15 declares, the last enemy to be destroyed is death. Our King walked directly into death and came out victorious on the other side.
- The Gospel Reality: The King wore a crown of thorns, the Priest offered His own blood, and the Warrior conquered the grave. By faith, He joins us to His victory and shares His inheritance with us.

Call to Action / Reflection Question: Which false version of Jesus (the comfort plushie, the political tool, or the personal assistant) have you been relying on, and what area of your life do you need to surrender to the real King today?
