Sermon Notes — Proverbs 3:9–10

"Our Present. Their Gift." — Giving & Generosity**

Opening

- Topic: Worshiping God with our wealth.
- People have many opinions on giving—especially at Christmas.
- We don't consult culture; we consult **God's Word**.
- Reminder: We believe the Bible is God's authoritative, trustworthy Word.

Context

- Proverbs = wisdom from Solomon for everyday life.
- Proverbs 3:9-10:
 - Honor the Lord with your wealth and firstfruits.
 - o Then God supplies abundantly.

Main Idea

Giving is worship. Wealth is one of the ways we express trust in God.

1. Worship With Our Wealth

"Honor" = attribute worth → worship word.

- Wealth = entire financial world (salary, investments, possessions, assets, inheritance, etc.).
- Not about spare change—holistic stewardship.

Why We Struggle: Ownership

- Bible teaches: Everything belongs to God.
 - Exodus 19:5 all the earth is God's.
 - Job 41:11 everything under heaven is His.
 - Haggai 2:8 silver & gold are His.
 - Deut. 8:17–18 God gives power to get wealth.
- Our money ≠ ours. **Wealth is God's on loan.**

Illustration: Ownership

- If I give YOU \$45k of MY \$50k → you feel grateful.
- If I take \$5k of YOUR \$50k → you feel robbed.
- Our view of ownership shapes our view of giving.

If God owns it all, we feel grateful for what we keep, not robbed by what He asks for.

2. Firstfruits: Who Gets First?

- Wisdom = choosing what/who we worship.
- Your first dollars reveal your first love.
- Firstfruits = God gets the first *and* best.

• Tithe (10%) = baseline **faithfulness**, not generosity.

Enjoying Wealth Isn't Sin

- Ecclesiastes 9 enjoy food, spouse, work, gladness.
- Pleasure becomes sin when it becomes **first**.
- Issue isn't enjoyment—it's **entitlement**.

3. God Rejects "Lame Leftovers"

- OT: offerings were *public* acts of worship.
- Problem: Israel gave unusable leftovers.
- God wasn't offended by amount but order.
- Worship costs us our **first & best**, not last & least.

Common Mistake

- Budget for ourselves → give God leftovers.
- That is not worship; it's **disobedience**.

True worship = God first. We ask not "How much dare I give?" but "How much dare I keep?"

4. The Gospel Motivation

Before we honored God with wealth, God honored us with His.

- Jesus = God's first and best, not leftovers.
- Jesus didn't tithe His blood—He gave all.
- We give because **He first gave** (1 John).

This is the fuel for generosity.

5. God's Promise

- Proverbs 3:10 barns filled, vats bursting.
- Not prosperity gospel → God gives better treasure than money.

6. Response / Next Steps

Proverbs 3:5–8 — Trust God in all your ways.

Next steps:

- 1. **Don't give at all?** Start. Give something.
- 2. **Give sporadically?** Become consistent.
- 3. **Give consistently?** Grow in sacrificial generosity.

Worship includes your wallet.

Everything is His. We give our whole selves in worship.
