“Freely Give”

“Freely you have received, freely give.” Matthew 10:8

Matthew 10 documents the first second wave global summit when Jesus first commissioned his disciples.

The first wave was, *“follow me and I will make you fishers of men” (Matthew 4:19.)*

The second wave was *“go... proclaim the kingdom... heal the sick... raise the dead... cleanse lepers... cast out demons” (Matthew 10:5-8.)*

You and I gather here to be commissioned into another Second Wave, the Second Wave of the College of Prayer.

To take the Gospel of the kingdom to the ends of the earth.

To make upper room disciples of all nations.

To ready the church to reach the final unreached people on earth, and to be ready for the return of Christ.

These words of Jesus to the first second wave summit are for us here today at this Second Wave Summit.

“Freely you have received, freely give.” Matthew 10:8

Freely receive is first wave.

Freely give is second wave.

Freely receive is fullness.

Freely give is fulfillment.

In a sense, these two simple phrases describe the entire flow of kingdom advancement.

Freely receive, freely give is the healthy cadence of every kingdom leader.

And do not miss the sequence, *freely receive* always precedes *freely give*.

Christ’s Work In You

Christ’s Work Through You

“And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction.” Matthew 10:1

Just as Jesus called to Himself his disciples, he has called us to Himself.

And Jesus is here to give you authority.

“These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them, ‘Go nowhere among the Gentiles and enter no town of the Samaritans.’” Matthew 10:5

1. He gave them authority. v. 1

2. He gave them limitations. v. 5

3. He gave them territorial jurisdiction. v. 6

4. He gave them a message. v. 7

5. He gave them power.

6. He gave them the fullness-fulfillment kingdom cadence.

“Freely you have received, freely give.” Matthew 10:8

He sent them with specific guidelines.

Go with proper motives. vv. 9, 10

Look for responsiveness. vv. 11-14

Go with urgency. v. 16

Go with vigilance and sobriety. v. 16

Count the cost. vv. 17, 18

Expect the supernatural. vv. 19, 20

Don't be surprised by persecution. vv. 21-25

As Jesus commissioned his first disciples, he was mindful of commissioning his final disciples.

"When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next, for truly, I say to you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes." Matthew 10:23

Jesus needed to teach his disciples to contend with fear because he knew their calling would be contested.

"Have no fear." Matthew 10:26 Say it with me!

"Do not fear." Matthew 10:27 Say it with me!

"Fear not." Matthew 10:31 Say it with me!

Jesus gave them a power greater than their fear in order to displace their fear.

"So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." Matthew 10:32, 33

Jesus replaced nationalism, tribalism, and even family loyalties with a higher allegiance to himself.

"Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law. And a person's enemies will be those of his own household. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." Matthew 10:34-39

Jesus assured them of significant rewards. Mathew 10:40-42

These words of Jesus are just as significant for this Second Wave, as they were for the first second wave.

ACTIVATION

Your calling is fulfilled first in coming to Christ for fullness, and then being sent in Christ for fulfillment.

Receive your authority in Christ.

Receive your empowerment in Christ.

Fulfill your calling in Christ.
