“A Call to the Watchman”

“O Jerusalem, I have posted watchmen on your walls; they will pray day and night, continually. Take no rest, all you who pray to the Lord. Give the Lord no rest until he completes his work, until he makes Jerusalem the pride of the earth.”
Isaiah 62:6-7

God appoints watchmen on the walls who pray day and night, giving the Lord no rest until His purposes are fulfilled.

God is raising up watchmen in this season of transition—those who watch *with* Him in prayer, discernment, and obedience.

What Is a Watchman?

- A **mantle**, not just a role
- A **heavenly assignment** rooted in Scripture
- One who lives connected to **heaven and earth**
- Positioned to guard **cities, families, churches, and movements**

Jesus’ Call: “Could you not watch with Me?” (Matt. 26:40–41)

Biblical Foundation of the Watchman

- **Isaiah** – Watchmen on the walls
- **Ezekiel & Jeremiah** – Prophetic watchmen who warn
- **Habakkuk** – Watchman who watches, waits, and writes
- **Anna (Luke 2)** – Watchman-prophet and gatekeeper
- **Gatekeepers** – Priests, pastors, apostles guarding worship and truth

Scriptures’ Cry:

“Stand on the wall and at the gates. Watch. Warn. Weep. Worship. Welcome. Wait.”

What Watchmen Do

1. Watch

- Stand alert to hear and see what God is saying (Hab. 2:1)
- Discern times, seasons, and enemy schemes (2 Cor. 2:11)
- Guard doctrine and truth at the gates (Mark 13:33)

Watchman Anointing:

A prophetic mantle of vigilance, responsibility, and spiritual attentiveness

2. Warn

- Hear God's word and release it faithfully (Ezek. 3:17)
 - Warn of danger, compromise, misalignment, and deception
 - Call assemblies and announce times and seasons
 - The watchman is accountable to warn clearly—an uncertain sound brings confusion (1 Cor. 14:8).

3. Weep

- Carry God's burden for people, cities, and nations
- Grieve over sin, compromise, and captivity
- Stand in travail and intercession for the lost (Joel 2:17)
- Sense danger before it manifests
- Cry out against deception disguised as progress.
- Intercede in secret places while others sleep

4. Worship

- Guard the purity of worship and the presence of God
- Serve as gatekeepers of the temple (1 Chron. 9)
- Protect the wine, oil, incense, and spices-The temple/kingdom treasures.

Examples:

- **Obed-Edom** – Became a gatekeeper to remain near God's presence
- **Anna** – Worshiped day and night, announcing the Messiah
- **Habakkuk** – Watchman and singer

Isaiah 52:8: Watchmen lift their voices and sing for joy.

5. Welcome

- Open the gates for what the King welcomes (Psalm 24:9)
- Prohibit what the King has not invited
- Welcome the Kingdom of God and the glory of the Lord

Authority of Watchmen-Gatekeepers:

- Bind and loose with the keys of the Kingdom (Matt. 16:19)
- Guard Kingdom treasures
- Remove veils to welcome transformation (2 Cor. 3:16–18)
- Gatekeepers have a level of deep intimacy and authority.

6. Wait

- Spend long seasons watching and waiting on the Lord
- Remind the church of God's faithfulness during delay
- Stay alert for prophetic moments and fulfillment

Psalm 130:6:

“My soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen wait for the morning.”
