CHURCH ON FIRE

FRED A. HARTLEY, III

Acts 1-2

When Christ built his church, he set it on fire.

It is impossible for a church on fire to be lukewarm.

"Fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:3-4

God promises to set his church on fire.

"I baptize you with water for repentance, but he who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." Matthew 3:11

"For John baptized in water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Acts 1:5

- » Fire is the manifesting presence of Christ.
- » Fire is a promise.
- » Church on fire is normal.
- » Church on fire is the prototype of every church.
- » Pentecost is not exceptional; Pentecost is the norm. The way Jesus started the church in the beginning is the same way he will restore his church before his return.
- » When God sends the fire of his manifesting presence, it is never arbitrary, it is always strategic.
- » There is always significant preparatory work for every reviving work of God.

Operation 2033

Many of the largest church networks on earth are now gearing up for the 2,000 year celebration of the death, burial, resurrection, and ascension of Christ.

- » Jesus Celebration 2033, founded by Oliver Fleury, is planning toward a two-thousand-year resurrection celebration in the Holy Lands. See www.jc2033.world.
- » Wycliffe Bible Translators are teaming up with nine other missional Bible translators to eradicate Bible poverty by 2033. While there are 6,000 vital languages spoken worldwide, today 3,800 have little or no scripture in their language. Wycliffe and their team project that by 2033, 99.96% of the world will have the New Testament and 100% will have some portion of scripture
- » Nicky Gumbel, founder of Alpha Course, has announced their 2033 audacious goal of serving 100 million people (currently 30 million).
- » MM33 is an initiative of the WAGF (World Assemblies of God Fellowship) to grow their current 370,000 churches to 1 million churches worldwide by 2033
- » Rick Warren has been calling the broader body of Christ to 100% participation in completing the great commission by 2033. He has announced the "3B Goals"—that everyone in the world will have access to the Bible, a believer, and the body of Christ by 2033.
- » The Roman Catholic Church is also targeting year 2033 as their two-thousandth anniversary, calling it the Celebration of the Greatest Jubilee of all jubilees.
- » ARISE 2033 is perhaps the most comprehensive evangelistic initiative launched by International Pentecostal Holiness Church. They currently have ministry in 75% of the 3,142 counties in the U.S., with ministry in 150 nations.
- » Salt & Light, a global coalition, has initiated the aggressive goal to reach all 8 billion people by 2033, one person at a time. This Empowered21 vision is being co-chaired by Dr. William Wilson, president of Oral Roberts University, and Pastor Lawrence Khong, chairman of LoveSingapore.

A. The Demolition Work of God's Preparation.

- 1. The demolition of enemy number one—pride.
- » Pride of self-accomplishment. "Though they all fall away because of you, I will never fall away" Matthew 26:33
- » Pride of superiority. "Even if I must die with you, I will not deny you." Matthew 26:35
- » Pride of selfish ambition and jealousy. "Dispute also arose among them, as to which of them was to be regarded as the greatest." Luke 22:24
- » Pride of family ambition. "Say that these two sons of mine are to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your kingdom." Matthew 20:21
- 2. The demolition of enemy number two—prayerlessness.

- » Jesus gave a promise. "For John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now." Acts 1:5 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8

2. Activation of prayer.

"Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James." - » Activation of prayer always includes activation of our receptors. "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." Acts 2:4
- » Activation of our receptors always welcomes fire! "And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them." Acts 2:3
- » Fire always brings worship. "We hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." Acts 2:11
- » Fire always brings harvest. "So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls." Act 2:41 "The Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved." Acts 2:47

In Jesus name demolish pride.

LESSON TWO

LUKEWARM NO MORE

FRED A. HARTLEY, III

Revelation 3:14-24

Christ loves his church with a white-hot love, and expects a white-hot love in response.

No one likes lukewarm—not lukewarm coffee, lukewarm tea, nor lukewarm fries! But God has an even stronger reaction to lukewarm—it makes him vomit. "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth." Revelation 3:15-16

God uses crude language to describe how nauseating lukewarmness is to him. These words are harsh. Offensive. Repulsive. These words show how harsh, offensive, and repulsive lukewarmness is to a white-hot God.

Lukewarm Christ

Indifferent All-in
Disinterested Do-whatever-it-takes
Mediocre Zealous
Non-committal Lay-down-your-life
Tepid White-hot
Half-hearted Wholehearted

The discrepancy between Christ and a lukewarm heart is nauseating.

A lukewarm church hides behind 3 strongholds.

- 1. "Lukewarm is normal." "I know your works: you are neither cold nor hot. Would that you were either cold or hot! So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth." Revelation 3:15-16
- 2. "Lukewarm is unavoidable." "For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing, not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked." Revelation 3:17
- 3. "Lukewarm is incurable." "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." Revelation 3:20

Today we will attack these 3 strongholds and pull them down once and for all. "A wise man scales the city of the mighty and brings down the stronghold in which they trust." Proverbs 21:22

- » In reality, lukewarm is not only bad, it makes God vomit.
- » Lukewarm does not come with prosperity, it comes with pride and arrogance.
- » Lukewarm is actually the easiest disease to cure—it is simply a matter of Presence.

The cure for the lukewarm church is the manifest presence of Christ. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." Revelation 3:20 The beauty of Presence, is that you cannot do Presence, only God does Presence.

You can't do fire; only God does fire.

The secondary issue with the lukewarm church is they have never learned to receive from God.

- » "You are poor," because they have never received riches from God.
- » "You are naked," because they have never received clothing from God.
- » "You are blind," because they have never received spiritual sight.

"I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see."

Revelation 3:18

- » "Buy from me gold"- Receive riches from God.
- » "Righteousness"- Receive clothing from God.
- » "Eye salve"- Receive spiritual sight.

Revival-Praying with Certainty: 7 reasons you can pray for revival with absolute certainty that it is coming.

- 1. The Bible promises revival. "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" Luke 11:13
- 2. God's nature reinforces revival. "For I know that my redeemer lives." Job 19:25
- 3. God's name reinforces revival. "Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he dies, yet shall he live." John 11:25
- 4. The nature of the church requires revival. "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser... Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:1, 4-5
- 5. The darkness of our world system necessitates revival. "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For behold, darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will be seen upon you." Isaiah 60:1-2
- 6. The flow of human history illustrates revival. "But when the people of Israel cried out to the LORD, the LORD raised up a deliverer for the people of Israel, who saved them, Othniel the son of Kenaz, Caleb's younger brother. The Spirit of the LORD was upon him, and he judged Israel." Judges 3:9-10
- 7. Christian leaders testify to revival. "Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?" Psalm 85:6

ACTIVATION

Christ loves the lukewarm church. "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent." Revelation 3:19

Christ's message is part of His loving, chastening.

- » Repent of settling for prayer without Presence.
- » Receive his word.
- » Receive his zeal.
- » Receive humility and the spirit of repentance.
- » Receive his Presence.

Break off hopelessness.

Be an overcomer. "The one who conquers, I will grant him to sit with me on my throne, as I also conquered and sat down with my Father on his throne." Revelation 3:21

LESSON THREE

GOD'S PURPOSE IN REVIVAL

BILL HYER

Reach a lost world through a *revived* church.

What is revival? To bring back to life. This is what we see in the accounts of historic revivals.

Revival is the sovereign work of God.

- (a) Revival comes in answer to prayer. "and My people who are called by My name humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." 2 Chronicles 7:14
- (b) Revival comes through the truth of the Word of God. "Now they have come to know that everything which You have given Me is from You." John 17:7
- (c) Revival brings conviction of sin. "And He, when He comes, will convict the world regarding sin, and righteousness, and judgment." John 16:8
- (d) Revival results in repentance. "Peter said to them, 'Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38
- (e) Ultimately revival is the sovereign work of God. "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church; and the gates of Hades will not overpower it." Matthew 16:18 (See also Romans 9:9)

Revival is an essential aspect of God's eternal purpose and plan.

"He made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He set forth in Him, regarding His plan of the fullness of the times, to bring all things together in Christ, things in the heavens and things on the earth. In Him we also have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things in accordance with the plan of His will." Ephesians 1:9-11 (See also Ephesians 3:8-11)

What is God's ultimate purpose?

- » It is to glorify Himself by making Himself known as He fills the earth with His holy, manifest presence in and through His people, composed of individuals from every nation, who are made alive and transformed into the image and likeness of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, so that the whole earth will be living under and according to His sovereign kingdom rule and the whole earth, and ultimately the whole universe, will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of God.
- » Revival in His Church that reaches a lost world is essential to this.

Revival is the revelation of God making known who He is.

"And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent. "John 17:3

Revival comes as God fills the earth with His holy, manifest presence.

"For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea." Habakkuk 2:14 (See also Genesis 1:28)

Revival comes in and through His people composed of individuals from every nation.

"And I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed." Genesis 12:3 (See also Romans 11:25–26)

Revival makes alive and transforms His people into the image and likeness of His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.

"For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son..." Romans 8:29 (See also Genesis 1:26-27)

Revival results in the continual increase of the Kingdom rule of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth.

"There will be no end to the increase of His government or of peace. On the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness. From then on and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of armies will accomplish this." Isaiah 9:7 (See also Genesis 1:28)

The ultimate purpose of revival is that the whole earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of God.

Revival comes at the time of great moral decline.

"For I will pour water on the thirsty land and streams on the dry ground; I will pour out My Spirit on your offspring, and My blessing on your descendants." Isaiah 44:3

God's purpose will prevail to reach a lost world through a revived church! **WORDS FROM GOD**

LESSON FOUR

PASTOR TO PASTOR

7 Field-Tested Tools To Build a Praying Church

FRED A. HARTLEY, III

"My house shall be called a house of prayer." Matthew 21:13

Most pastors who have effectively built praying churches have used these seven field-tested tools.

1. Consistently pray, "Lord, teach us to pray."

This short, five-word prayer may seem harmless, but it is the biggest prayer you will ever pray—when God answers this prayer, you can receive everything He has for you. A praying church is built by Christ and a praying pastor. A pastor can delegate many things, but they dare not delegate prayer

2. Pray with your spouse.

Failure to pray with your spouse, if married, is the Achilles heel for many Christian leaders. "Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered. 1 Peter 3:7

If you have not been praying consistently with your spouse, humble yourself, repent, and resolve to start today. It will be transformational.

3. Build your Prayer Shield.

A Prayer Shield is a team of fifteen or more prayer partners whom you have recruited to pray for you consistently, and with whom you communicate at least monthly. "Pray...also for me that words may be given to me in opening my mouth boldly to proclaim the mystery of the Gospel." Ephesians 6:18-19

4. Recruit your Prayer Team.

A local church Prayer Team is responsible for mobilizing prayer throughout your church family. Recruiting your Prayer Team Leader who directs the Prayer Team is vital. "Epaphras, who is one of you, a servant of Christ Jesus, greets you, always struggling on your behalf in his prayers, that you may stand mature and fully assured in all the will of God." Colossians 4:12

5. Ask Christ for prayer rhythms unique to your church setting.

This will likely include:

- » A weekly prayer gathering
- » A monthly prayer gathering
- » Nights of Prayer
- » Seasons of fasting

6. Establish a Campus of the College of Prayer.

See Session Three: Building a Praying Church.

7. Lead your leadership team to embrace Christ-encountering prayer as priority number one.

Put prayer as number one on your Job Description.

Turn your Elders/Deacons meeting into a Christ-encountering prayer meeting.

Turn every meeting in your church into a flame-holder, welcoming the manifesting presence of Christ.

LESSON FIVE

BUILDING A PRAYING CHURCH

FRED A. HARTLEY, III

"One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples." Luke 11:1

"On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about." Acts 1:4

"They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers." Acts 1:14

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer." Acts 2:42

The purpose of this session is to give you everything you need to build a Christ-encountering church, and a Presence-based church culture, by implementing a three-year strategy known as a campus of the College of Prayer.

Our mission is to mentor pastors and leaders to reach a lost world through a revived church.

Mission Statement of the College of Prayer

Campus: A campus of the College of Prayer is built by a Servant Leadership Team (SLT) of 2-5 pastors and leaders committed to the College of Prayer mission, with influence to gather fifty-plus people twice a year for three years, using our three-year curriculum.

College of Prayer Curriculum

Year 1 - "Lord, Teach Us to Pray"

Year 2 - "Lord, As Families, Teach Us to Pray"

Year 3 - "Lord, As Churches, Teach Us to Pray"

Four Elements for Establishing a Campus

The College of Prayer is called to serve pastors and their local churches. A campus provides a pastor with the

structure to do ministry the way Jesus did.

- » To mentor key leaders in Christ-encountering prayer.
- » To build a Christ-encountering prayer culture within your church.
- » To raise the level of God's manifest presence in every area of church life.

Jesus took three years to build a culture of God-encountering prayer with His disciples, and you will not do it any faster.

Rationale For A Campus

A campus follows the same three-year pattern Jesus used of missional mentoring.

The purpose of a campus is to provide an environment where pastors and Christian leaders encounter the manifest presence of Christ, and where they can mentor their leaders to build a praying church in order to reach a lost world through a revived church. A revived church is a praying church, and it is a revived church that will impact its community and nation.

- » Christ-encountering prayer is the power cell of the church, and a campus provides an equivalent for a corporate prayer encounter with the manifest presence of Christ.
- » Mentoring was Jesus' method, and it is your mandate. A campus provides a highly transferable mentoring opportunity.
- » Jesus took three years to make upper room disciples, and you will not do it any faster. No church wants their corporate prayer life to be a mile wide and an inch deep. The three-year process will give you the opportunity you need to take prayer deep so that it is sustainable.

OUR BRIEF HISTORY

In 1996 Fred Hartley invited fifty pastor friends from across the U.S. to come to Atlanta for four days of prayer, worship, and revival-prayer teaching. They met Christ. There was deep repentance and refreshment came from the presence of the Lord. Seven pastors said they were ready to drop out of ministry but decided to continue because God had re-called them. These same pastors and leaders gathered again six months later, and 120 pastors and leaders came, including some from Canada, Norway, and Africa. Three years later there was a campus of the College of Prayer in those nations as well. Today there are 370,792 campuses in 150+ nations serving more than 30 million pastors and leaders. All glory to Christ!

Two Types of Campuses

Local Church Campus

A Local Church Campus serves the local church and has a Servant Leadership Team made up of leaders from within the local church. It is designed to build a culture of Christ-encountering prayer where local church leaders are mentored in revival-prayer for three years. Every local church campus is encouraged to invite neighboring pastors and their people to participate in modules, and it can certainly become a Regional Campus. Often these local churches will become prayer-pacesetters in the region.

Regional Campus

A Regional Campus serves churches in the region with a Servant Leadership Team normally made up of leaders from several different local churches, including at least one or two pastors. It is hosted at a local church (or can rotate between several local churches) and helps create a prayer movement within the region. God moves when churches unite.

How To Start A Campus

- 1. Pray. Ask Christ if a College of Prayer campus will serve your church. Listen to what He says.
- 2. Share your vision with your local church leadership team. Share the following documents with your leaders.
- » Let Me Introduce You to the College of Prayer document

- » College of Prayer Brochure
- » Three Year Curriculum
- » Utilize the "How to Start a Local Church Campus" video.
- 3. Contact the College of Prayer Leadership Team and share your process. We are here to help you.
- 4. Schedule your first module.

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. What will this cost my church? We have done everything possible to give away everything for FREE. Hard copies of curriculum are best purchased through our College of Prayer office. Obviously normal ministry expenses are expected to be covered on an individual basis (airfare, lodging, and appropriate honorarium if someone from our team comes to serve you).
- 2. How long does a module last? A module requires 9-12 hours. Normally we recommend Friday night (3 hours), Saturday morning (3 hours) and Saturday afternoon (3 hours).
- 3. What exactly is a campus? A campus is a gathering of fifty or more believers who meet together twice a year (2 modules each year) for three years (for a total of 6 modules) using our three-year curriculum, led by a Servant Leadership Team of 2-5 pastors and leaders who are committed to the College of Prayer vision.
- » Year 1: "Lord, Teach Us to Pray" (Modules 1 and 2)
- » Year 2: "Lord, As Families, Teach Us to Pray" (Modules 3 and 4)
- » Year 3: "Lord, As Churches, Teach Us to Pray" (Modules 5 and 6)
- 4. Who does the teaching? You and your local church leaders are welcome to do the teaching, though we recommend utilizing one of our trained College of Prayer leaders for at least the first module. When you contact our leadership team we will explain in greater detail.
- 5. Is anyone available to help coach me? Yes, our Leadership Team is here to serve you and from time to time we offer a 7-week mentoring track. We look forward to hearing from you.
- 6. What other revival-prayer resources do you have? We have three levels of revival-prayer resources.

7. How is the College of Prayer distinct from other prayer ministries? There are several ways in which the College of Prayer is unique. While virtually every prayer ministry is biblical and helpful, the College of Prayer is relational, missional, reproducible, and field-tested.

Relational. The kingdom of God travels along relational lines. Just as Christ mentored leaders for three years, we look for three-year minimum relationships.

Missional. The kingdom of God runs on the fullness-fulfillment principle. Fullness is Christ's work in us; fulfillment is Christ's work through us. Virtually every other prayer ministry is entirely fullness. The prayer movement of the College of Prayer is equally fullness and fulfillment.

Reproducible. Because our curriculum is biblical and kingdom, it is not enculturated with North American baggage. For this reason, many of the largest church networks on earth are using our curriculum.

Field-tested. We now have over 50,000 volunteers teaching our curriculum in 370,792 campuses to over 30 million believers in 150+ nations. All glory to Christ!

It's our desire to bring the most in-depth, long-lasting, far-reaching, church-reviving, community-impacting

prayer mentorship and training to the local church. We are here to serve you as you seek to honor Christ and build a house of prayer for all nations.

Why 10 Virgins?

Virgins represent moral integrity and purity.

"Nevertheless, the firm foundation of God stands, having this seal: 'The Lord knows those who are His;' and, 'Everyone who names the name of the Lord is to keep away from wickedness." 2 Timothy 2:19

Why the Bridegroom?

The Bridegroom is an image of Christ—particularly the eagerly awaited second coming of Christ! "They will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky, with power and glory." Matthew 24:30 "Here's the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!" Matthew 25:6

Why Lamps?

The lamps represent each follower of Christ and our ability to be filled by God's presence.

"Jesus answered him, 'If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him." John 14:23

The flame, or light, from the lamp represents watchfulness and readiness.

"Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour." 1 Peter 5:8

Why Oil?

The oil is the in-dwelling personal presence of God, the Holy Spirit. As a car's engine is made to run on gas, so we are made to run on the empowering, personal, manifest presence of God!

"Instead, be filled with the Spirit." Ephesians 5:18

"Your anointing has made me strong and mighty. You've empowered my life for triumph by pouring fresh oil over me." Psalms 92:10 (TPT)

The Holy Spirit gives us the spiritual grit needed to persevere until the end, but there is a price to be paid. "For you say, I am rich, I have prospered, and I need nothing, not realizing that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked. I counsel you to buy from me gold refined by fire, so that you may be rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself and the shame of your nakedness may not be seen, and salve to anoint your eyes, so that you may see." Revelation 3:17-18

Why the Flasks?

Many today are living depleted, lonely, and unprepared. Many in the church might outwardly look like a bridesmaid with all the garb and jewelry—even having a lamp—but they are unprepared to go the distance. Their hearts are given to another. The extra oil is the defining difference between those welcomed into the Bridegroom, and those who are shut out.

History is racing towards its climax and Jesus wants us to be prepared for the unique pressures this hour brings.

ACTIVATION

We are not self-created or self-sustaining beings. We are made to be sustained by the presence of God. God made us and He made us to run on Himself.

What are you doing on a daily basis to make sure you have enough oil to go the distance? What are you doing to cultivate a reserve of the presence of God in your life?

Ask God to refill your lamp.

LESSON SEVEN

BAPTISM IN ZEAL

FRED A. HARTLEY, III

"Be zealous and repent." Revelation 3:19
"Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord." Romans 12:11
"Zeal for your house will consume me." John 2:17 (Psalm 69:9)

God wants to baptize every servant of Christ in holy zeal.

Holy zeal does not make you odd or excessive; holy zeal empowers you to supernaturally serve Christ the way He serves the church.

- » Zeal is Holy Spirit adrenaline.
- » Zeal is essential for every kingdom leader.

The moment you sign on to follow Christ, something inside you longs for zeal. Zeal is yours for the taking.

In a lukewarm church culture, zeal will seem like a hard-sell. It may seem odd, strange, peculiar, or even threatening. But don't be deceived. Zeal is normal for every Christian leader.

"A disciple can be forgiven if he does not have great mental ability. He can be forgiven also if he does not display outstanding physical prowess. But no disciple can be excused if he does not have zeal. If his heart is not aflame with a red-hot passion for the Savior, he stands condemned."

- William McDonald

Christ was zealous for only one thing—God's house, and, more accurately, God's manifesting presence within the house.

- » A lukewarm church has two flagrant deficiencies: prayer and Presence.
- » A lukewarm spirit is a disease; zeal is the cure.

"Do all the good you can, in all the ways you can, to all the souls you can, in every place you can, at all the times you can, with all the zeal you can, as long as ever you can." - John Wesley

Insights Into Zeal

- 1. God is zealous, and he is the baptizer in zeal.
- "The zeal of the Lord of Hosts will do this." Isaiah 37:32
- "The Lord goes out like a mighty man, like a man of war he stirs up his zeal." Isaiah 42:13
- 2. Christ himself was baptized in zeal.
- "Zeal for your house will consume me." John 2:17
- 3. Zeal will accomplish things through you that nothing else will accomplish.

"The zeal of the Lord of Hosts will do this." Isaiah 9:7, 37:32

The zeal of the Lord will advance Christ's kingdom. "Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end...the zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this." Isaiah 9:7

"He put on righteousness as a breastplate, and the helmet of salvation on his head; he put on garments of vengeance for clothing and wrapped himself in zeal as a cloak." Isaiah 59:17

4. Watch out for misguided zeal.

"As to zeal, a persecutor of the church." Philippians 3:6

Soulish zeal is the enemy of the kingdom.

Zeal that flows from the Holy Spirit through the human spirit is kingdom adrenaline—it empowers you to supernaturally fulfill your calling.

5. Death-to-self qualifies you to be zeal-ready.

"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Galatians 2:20

"Then Jesus told his disciples, 'If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." Matthew 16:24

6. Holy Spirit zeal flows out of the human spirit, not the soul.

"Fervent in spirit." Romans 12:11

"Look down from heaven and see, from your holy and beautiful habitation. Where are your zeal and your might? The stirring of your inner parts and your compassion are held back from me." Isaiah 63:15

7. Every kingdom leader is zeal-capable, and every effective kingdom leader is zeal-baptized.

"Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord." Romans 12:11

"Take care not to give up your first zeal; beware of cooling in the least degree. You were hot and earnest once; be hot and earnest still and let the fire which once bunt within you still animate you. Be men of might and vigor, men who serve their God with diligence and zeal." - Charles Spurgeon

2. Let zeal flow from Christ into your spirit.

FLAME HOLDERS: THE NEW NORMAL

"Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest."

Revelation 1:12-13

"As for the mystery of the seven stars that you saw in my right hand, and the seven golden lampstands, the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches." Revelation 1:20

There is nothing more relevant as Christian leaders than to clarify who is Christ today and who is the church? Revelation 1 answers both questions.

Illustration: When my only daughter got engaged, we put on a full-court press to get wedding-ready. Prepare the budget; reserve the church; reception; photographer; play list; hotels; menu; cake; dress; invitations. But despite months of rigorous preparation, our daughter was not at all ready three hours before, not two hours before, nor even one hour before. But in the last 45 minutes she turned into a thing of beauty.

The church (who is the bride of Christ) may not look like much today, but in the last minutes before the return of Christ, she will be ready.

- » Repentance-ready
- » Harvest-ready
- » Return-ready

Who Christ Is Today

Christ is ascended, glorified, exalted, King of Kings, and Lord of Lords. He is revealed in Revelation 1:12-18. He is the manifest presence of God.

Christ is on fire from head to toe.

- » His head is white like wool.
- » His eyes are like flames of fire.
- » His feet are glowing like molten metal.
- » His right hand holds seven stars—balls of fire.
- » His face is shining like the sun in full strength.

Who the Church Is Today

The church is the flame holder of the manifest presence of Christ. "Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands." Revelation 1:12

ACTIVATION

Declare Christ to be the ascended, glorified, exalted, enthroned, King of Kings and Lord of Lords—the manifest presence of God.

Declare your church to be a flame holder of the manifest presence of Christ.
