session one The Foundation of HOPE

The hope of the world is the church of Jesus Christ. The hope of the church is the manifest presence of Christ.

The only place on earth where Christ sends His presence is to the house of prayer.

The most significant building project on earth today is the building of houses of prayer. When Christ built His first house of prayer, it took Him three years. He needed to teach His disciples to pray.

- » He modeled prayer.
- » He taught prayer.
- » He facilitated prayer.

Christ puts His finishing touches on His house of prayer following the resurrection and prior to His ascension.

- » He gave His disciples a command. Acts 1:4
- » He gave His disciples a promise. Acts 1:4b-5

Every disciple went to the house of prayer. Acts 1:14-15.

DEFINITION: A house of prayer is a gathering of praying Christians who encounter the manifest presence of Christ. Anywhere. Anytime. Anyone.

This house of prayer is the template for Christ's church. The house of prayer is the hope of the world.

Into this house of prayer Jesus led His disciples. Into this house of prayer Jesus would pour out His Holy Spirit. Out of this house of prayer Jesus would thrust forth His empowered people. Out of this house of prayer Jesus would fulfill His mission.

5 DISTINCT MIRACLES OF A HOUSE OF PRAYER

What we discover in Acts 1 and 2 are five distinct miracles that characterize every house of prayer: **1.Gathering.**

"And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." Acts 1:13-14

2. Praying.

"All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." Acts 1:14

3. Receiving.

"And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:4

4. Ministering.

"We hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." Acts 2:11

5. Harvesting.

"So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls." Acts 2:41

"And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved." Acts 2:47b

session two HOPE IN THE DARKNESS

"Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen." Ephesians 3:20-21

When it comes to prayer, there are two irrefutable facts that are helpful to understand.

- » No one naturally knows how to pray.
- » Anyone can learn to pray.

We learn to pray in the house of prayer. The best way to learn to pray is with people who know how to pray.

The house of prayer is the only place on earth where Christ sends His presence. For this reason, the house of prayer is the house of hope.

DEFINITION: A house of prayer is a gathering of praying Christians who encounter the manifest presence of Christ. Anywhere. Anytime. Anyone.

Hope is worth fighting for. There are plenty of forces that will fight against hope.

Houses of prayer everywhere become houses of hope. Welcoming the manifest presence of Christ to your house of prayer is the key to becoming a house of hope. For this reason, the church becomes the hope of the world.

Hopelessness is the enemy of both the church and the world.

You are not only fighting for hope, the enemy is fighting against hope. Hopelessness is the tool of the devil.

The enemy lies to you: "Your weakness disqualifies you and your family from service for Christ." God says to you: "Your weakness qualifies you and your family to see the power of God."

Ephesians 3:20-21 is like a five-stage rocket with enough rocket fuel to get your house of prayer off the ground.

- » God is able to do **what we ask**.
- » He is able to do **all** we ask.
- » He is able to do *more* than all we ask.
- » He is able to do *far more abundantly* than all we ask.
- » He is able to do far more abundantly than all we ask or *think*.

Notice how God is able to do far more abundantly than all we ask or think "according to the power at work within us." How is God's power at work within us? In our weaknesses. "My strength is made perfect in your weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:9 Weakness refers to all kinds of weakness:

- » Physical
- » Financial
- » Mental
- » Spiritual
- » Emotional
- » Moral
- » Marital
- » Relational

God's strength is not made perfect in your strength; God's strength is made perfect in your **weakness**. Your weaknesses lie to you telling you, "God is not able." God invites you to take dominion over the enemies lies.

Your weaknesses must not lead to hopelessness. Your weaknesses are intended to lead you to hope in Christ.

MY RESPONSE

The key to your house of prayer is bringing your greatest current needs and weaknesses to Christ. The key to conquering hopelessness is sanctifying your weaknesses to God.

Declare over your needs, "I am not able, but my God is able!"

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." Romans 15:13

SESSION THREE HOPE FOR ALL SEASONS

"My house shall be a house of prayer." Luke 19:46

When Christ built His church, He built a house of prayer. The house of prayer became the hope if the world, because the house of prayer is where God sends His presence.

Christ is not arbitrary or random when He sends His manifest presence; He only sends His Holy Spirit strategically. He sends His Holy Spirit to a gathering of praying people who are prepared to receive His manifest presence.

DEFINITION: A house of prayer is a gathering of praying Christians who encounter the manifest presence of Christ. Anywhere. Anytime. Anyone.

The Book of Acts is full of houses of prayer.

- » All-Church House of Prayer Acts 1-2
- » Spontaneous House of Prayer Acts 3 (Peter and John)
- » Crisis House of Prayer Acts 4:24 (Early church)
- » Leadership House of Prayer Acts 6:4 (Apostles)
- » Private House of Prayer Acts 9:10 (Ananias)
- » Special Assignment House of Prayer Acts 9:16 (Ananias, Saul)
- » Missional House of Prayer Acts 10 (Peter and Cornelius)
- » Small Group House of Prayer Acts 13 (Barnabas, Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen, and Saul)
- » Family House of Prayer Acts 16:11 (Lydia)
- » Unlikely House of Prayer Acts 16:25 (Paul, Silas in prison)
- » Family House of Prayer Acts 16:31 (Philippian jailor)

No matter what season of life you are in, now is the season to build your house of prayer.

- » Single adults build houses of prayer with a best friend or roommate.
- » Newly married couples build a house of prayer with each other.
- » Families with small children build a house of prayer with each other.
- » Families with school-age children face many complexities and will receive great reward in their house of prayer.
- » Families with high school students may face the most challenges and receive the greatest rewards.
- » Single parents may feel overwhelmed and a house of prayer is just the relief they need.
- » Empty nesters have the easiest time building their house of prayer.

BUILDING INSTRUCTIONS

- » Be flexible and creative. Notice that no two houses of prayer are identical.
- » Be yourself. Welcome Christ into your house of prayer and allow Him to make it unique. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me." Revelation 3:20
- » Start small. "Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done

for them by my Father in heaven." Matthew 18:19

- » Receive the manifest presence of Christ.
 - "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." Matthew 18:20 "Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded." James 4:8

"You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all your heart." Jeremiah 29:13

» Be consistent. "Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving." Col. 4:2

Let me introduce you to the College of Prayer!

The College of Prayer International exists to serve Christ and His church. We lead local churches and church leaders to encounter the manifest presence of Christ and we help congregations become houses of prayer for all nations. The entire College of Prayer ministry is modeled after the way Christ made disciples and the way He built the Upper Room. Just as Jesus spent three years training His disciples to pray, so do we (Luke 11:1). Just as Jesus led His followers into the Upper Room to have a fresh encounter with His manifest presence (Acts 1:13), to fill them with His Holy Spirit (Acts 2:4) and then send them out to make disciples of all nations (Acts 1:8), so we are re-establishing this New Testament pattern all over the world.


The College of Prayer is a highly transferable paradigm of discipleship and evangelism designed to revive the Church and advance the kingdom of God by the power of the Spirit of God. We are convinced that prayer is not the latest church growth program; rather, it is a way of life. The College of Prayer intentionally enables students to grow in their own spiritual formation. We are seeing God pour out His reviving Spirit on His Church all over the world. He is calling His Church back to the Upper Room to be a house of prayer for all nations (Mark 11:17).

Our desire is to see every local church and every family revived as a house of prayer for all nations so that through the church Christ might reach the final unreached people on earth. We are convinced that the lost will never be reached through a lukewarm church. It is through a revived church that the final unreached people on earth will be reached.

Our mission is to mentor, train, and equip Christian pastors and leaders who will reach a lost world through a revived church.

The College of Prayer International was founded in 1997 by Fred Hartley and three other pastors who had a hunger for Christ and a desire and burden to advance His kingdom. Each of these leaders were mentored by Armin Gesswein. In 1996, Fred Hartley extended an invitation to 50 pastor-friends throughout North America to gather in Atlanta for prayer, and 79 showed up. Each of them encountered God in a profound way and agreed to meet three times a year for three years. Seven of the original group said that they were ready to drop out of the ministry, but when they encountered the reviving presence of Christ, they reaffirmed their calling.

By God's grace we currently have 308,056 Campuses with 925,206 Revival Prayer Groups in 104 nations with more than 15 million participants. Our core curriculum has now been translated into 24 languages.



<u>Three-Year Curriculum</u> Year 1 - "Lord, Teach Us to Pray" Year 2 - "Lord, As Families, Teach Us to Pray" Year 3 - "Lord, As Churches, Teach Us to Pray"

The College of Prayer is of benefit to pastors and leaders within a local church fellowship because it gives them an opportunity to slow down, encounter the manifest presence of Christ, listen to what God is saying, meet with people of similar passion, and learn life-transforming, biblical principles that are reproducible.

Four Levels of Benefit

- 1. Personal growth in Christ. Since every Module is Christ-encountering and empowering, the College of Prayer gives pastors and leaders an opportunity to receive replenishment twice a year for three years.
- 2. Leadership development. The College of Prayer provides a perfect environment for pastors and leaders to invite their leadership team into three years of biblical, life-transformational, Kingdom training.
- 3. Praying churches. As members of local congregations participate in the College of Prayer, they become prayer pace-setters for others throughout their church family.
- 4. Regional revival. Many College of Prayer Campuses have 20-plus different denominations all meeting together in one place at one time. This unity is catalytic towards a sustained move of God in an area.

What is a Campus?

The College of Prayer owns no buildings; we train leaders. A Campus of the College of Prayer is 3-5 pastors and leaders who are committed to the mission and curriculum of the College of Prayer and have the influence to gather 50-plus students for three years. Some Campuses are as large as 2,000 students and some as small as 50. The Campus meets for 2 days at a time, twice a year, for three years, and the impact is far-reaching on the students. This continuity of training allows for deep relationships to be fostered and life-changing principles to be embraced in a community setting. Students enjoy extended times of prayer, worship, repentance, cleansing, and renewal in addition to life-giving teaching. Best of all, they encounter the manifest presence of Christ together.

The College of Prayer leads leaders to a fresh encounter with Christ. We have discovered that when we encounter God, it normally includes five elements:

- » High worship
- » Deep repentance
- » Receiving forgiveness and freedom
- » Being filled with the Holy Spirit
- » Being empowered for ministry

The revival we are praying for is not parochial, shallow, or short-lived. We don't need a flash in the pan revival. The move of God we are praying for is Christ-exalting, pride-crushing, sin-exposing, Satan-evicting, repentance-welcoming, life-transforming, and nation discipling.
