2 Corinthians 10:3-6 (ESV) For though we walk in the flesh, we are not waging war according to the flesh. ⁴ For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. ⁵We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ, ⁶ being ready to punish every disobedience, when your obedience is complete.

Stronghold: A mindset that leads to conclusions contrary to the Bible.

Ephesians 4:27 (NIV)

"Tormentors" - Frustrations and/or Sedations

Romans 12:1-2 (NIV)


Discussion Questions

- 1) What impacted you the most from the week's message? Encouraged or Challenged you?
- 2) Read 2 Corinthians 10:3-6. Do you know of any strongholds in your past that you have dealt with? Any in your present? Are you motivated to "take back the ground?"
- 3) Read Ephesians 4:26-27. Have you ever struggled with forgiving others? Do you feel like 'the enemy had a foothold' because of it? Do you feel like this lead to a stronghold in your life?
- **4)** What are your thoughts on "tormentors" in your life? Are you attacked with frustrations, sedations, or both? Explain.
- 5) Read Psalm 23:3. Do you really believe that God is on your side? How can you trust Him more, on a daily basis, to be your Shepherd who restores your soul and leads you in paths of righteousness for His Name's sake?

Week #2

DEALING WITH STRONGHOLDS TAKING BACK THE **GROUN D**





- This grid represents our **soul** which is made up of our mind, will, and emotions.
- Bitterness, greed and immorality attract demonic activity.
- The enemy has **jurisdiction** over surrendered "ground". **Ephesians 4:27**
- A **stronghold** is created, which is a mind-set and conclusions contrary to Scripture. 2 Corinthians 10:4-5 God allows "tormentors" to afflict us, thereby warning and teaching us. Matthew 18:34
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- The steps to regain the surrendered "ground":
 - * Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal past offenses.
 - * Confess bitterness, greed, and/or immorality as sin.
 - * Claim the cleansing of Christ's blood. 1 John 1:9
 - * Ask Jesus to reclaim the "ground" that was surrendered. Psalm 23:3
 - * Pray and ask God to tear down the stronghold of habitual sin.
 - * Fully forgive all those who have offended you.
 - * Prepare for temptation by "sandbagging". (Scripture memory and application)
