Big Idea: Everybody enjoys a good love song... but do the lyrics ever truly come alive? God's Word redefines attraction, dating, intimacy, conflict, depth, and faithfulness. With Jesus at the center, as we trust His leading, our relationships can work. It's time to trust God's lyrics for your Love Song.

3) A Season of **Progress with Purpose**.

Song of Solomon 2:14 (NIV)

- Talk about your Plans Talk about your Past

4) In all seasons, **Protect** your **Purity**.

Song of Solomon 2:15 (NIV)

Put parameters around your passions

No unaccounted for <u>time</u> | Inform others of <u>boundaries</u> | Stay <u>Vertical</u> (<u>Horizontal</u> = Trouble!) Song of Solomon 3:1-5 (NIV)

Discussion Questions

- 1) What impacted you the most from this week's message? Encouraged you? Challenged you?

- **6)** Who can you talk to this week that may be struggling to accept the particular season God has them in regarding their relationships? How can you encourage them?
