

Galatians: Let Grace Work Slave or Son?

Sermon Notes

Big Idea: How can you tell the difference between engaging God as a religion, and enjoying God through a relationship. To sum it up in one word - the difference is GRACE. The Book of Galatians helps Christians eradicate a religious approach to God from our lives, so that we can pursue a joyous relationship with Him. Let's learn to *Let Grace Work*.

Religion: Trying to be Godly without God.

Two Key Questions:

- 1. Where is the 'Trap of Religion' holding me back?
- 2. How is a 'Relationship of Grace' actively setting me free?

Galatians 3:26-29; 4:1-7; 21-24a (ESV)

Slave or Son?

A slave has a master, a son has a Father.

A slave is a possession, a son is a part of a family.

A slave is powerless, a son is empowered.

A slave is <u>punished</u>, a son is <u>disciplined</u>.

A slave receives a wage, a son receives an inheritance.

A slave has <u>rules</u> to follow, a son has <u>responsibilities</u> to grow into.

A slave is chronically <u>insecure</u>, a son is <u>safe</u> and secure.

A slave's life is focused on doing, a son's life is focused on becoming.
