## **Sermon Notes**

**Big Idea:** Daniel found himself living in a culture not unlike ours. It was a world of rapid change, moral compromise, and pressure to conform. He found himself face to face with a series of future-defining decisions: compromise his values or stand for his convictions. His character, courage and convictions resulted in a reliable roadmap for the church today.

- Incentivization

Hananiah – "Yahweh has been gracious"

Shadrach – "I am fearful of God"

Mishael – "Who is like God?" Meshach – "I am despised,

contemptible, & humiliated"

Azariah - "Yahweh has helped me" Abednego - "Servant of Nebo"
