Discussion Questions

- 1. What impacted you the most from this week's message? Encouraged you? Challenged you?
- 2. Pastor Chris mentioned how our world is full of judgment, hypocrisy, cancellation, and judgment. Wisdom is ignored, there's political turmoil, and families are struggling. How have you felt this? How does it impact your daily attitude and perspective?
- 3. (Refer to Matthew 4) What do you think about when you hear that Christians are to live different and set apart? What does that mean? What does that look like?
- 4. Pastor Chris talked about how believers are called to reconcile focusing on their own sin first, they hold the standard for others by modeling a different way and gracefully restoring those around them. If you had to give yourself a grade based on how well do this, what grade would you get?
- 5. If someone asked you for some advice on how to speak the truth in love, what would you tell them based on your experiences? Share about a time you did this well or even about a time when you didn't do it well (but learned from it).
- 6. What is something happening in your life right now that you can't control and need others to pray for you to handle (to respond) in a way that would honor God? Are there any other personal take-aways from this week's message?
