Sermon Notes

Big Idea: Daniel found himself living in a culture not unlike ours. It was a world of rapid change, moral compromise, and pressure to conform. He found himself face to face with a series of future-defining decisions: compromise his values or stand for his convictions. His character, courage and convictions resulted in a reliable roadmap for the church today.

How do we maintain conviction in a culture of compromise? Communion \rightarrow Conviction \rightarrow Character \rightarrow Courage \rightarrow Change

Daniel 5:1-31 (ESV)

The Writing on the Wall:

- MENE MENE: Your Days are Numbered

Psalm 90:12 (ESV)

Are you living each day with Purpose?

- TEKEL: You have been weighed in the balances, and found wanting 2 Cor. 5:10 (ESV)

 Is their 'substance' in your life specifically the Character of Christ?
- PARSIN: Your kingdom will be divided and taken from you Matthew 6:33 (ESV)

 Are you living for God's Kingdom or your kingdom?

Devotion to Jesus is the place where the human heart is most satisfied.
