Sermon Notes

Big Idea: If God is really in control, why do bad things happen to Godly people? How can an Almighty God who is good, allow so much suffering in the lives of those He loves? Why does it often feel like evil is winning, darkness is prevailing, and God isn't answering our desperate prayers for rescue. What could we possibly learn from all this? This is a Study of God's Sovereignty, People's Suffering, and the Salvation of the Redeemed.

There's nothing more <u>sure</u> in life than suffering, and
There's nothing more <u>shaping</u> in life than suffering.

Satan is convinced that Christians will quit trusting God when we suffer.

The most <u>sacred</u> space for worship is found while suffering without <u>answers</u>.

Job 28:1-28 (ESV) Hebrews 5:7-8 (ESV)

Wisdom: Competency with regard to the complexities of life.

Wisdom <u>preserves</u> us through suffering, and it is also <u>produced</u> through suffering.

Wisdom is Notably Invaluable, yet Naturally Inaccessible.

Wise Fear of God: Unconditional trust in His love while in the midst of suffering.

Wisdom allows you to absorb the **shock** of suffering, as well as navigate the **pain**.

Wisdom that is **Tested** is Wisdom that can be **Trusted**.

- **5)** Read Hebrews 5:7-8. How has God tested your obedience through suffering? Has this made you wiser? Explain.
