James 1:19-27

Christianity is a <u>RESPONSE</u> to the love of God not a <u>RECIPE</u> for it.

WHO you are is more important than WHERE or WHAT you are.

1. Be quick to <u>LISTEN</u> but slow to <u>SPEAK</u> and slow to <u>ANGER</u>.

James 1:26

If the way we talk to or about <u>OTHERS</u> does not match how we talk about our faith in <u>GOD</u>, we need to ask ourselves if our faith is really in <u>GOD</u>.

<u>PATIENCE</u> produces the righteousness of God.

2. Be **READY** and **WILLING** to be changed by the **WORD** of God.

James 1:18; 21

3. Be a **DOER** of God's **WORD**.

James 1:22; 23-24

4. Be <u>FREE</u> and <u>BLESSED</u> by being someone who seeks to live God's Word.

James 1:25, 27

What we can do now to experience God's blessing (application):

- 1. Share your <u>FAITH</u> with those who haven't <u>LISTENED</u>.
 - 2. <u>SERVE</u> those who can't <u>SERVE</u> you back.
 - 3. Say <u>YES</u> to the next <u>RIGHT</u> thing.



Discussion Questions

- 1) What impacted you the most from this week's message? Encouraged you? Challenged you?
- **2)** Read James 1:19-20. How might following the three steps that James laid out put us in a better position to receive truth from God?
- **3)** Why is listening to the Word necessary for your spiritual growth? When has slowing down and listening to the Scriptures led to spiritual vibrancy in your life?
- 4) Read James 1:22-25. James 1:22 is the central point of the Book of James. Even though this verse is direct and self-explanatory, how would you rephrase it yourself? (God's Word is not meant for us to read it and then do nothing about it. Another way to say James 1:22 might be that when we receive God's Word, we respond to God's Word. The Bible is a living and active book that is able to speak to our lives at any moment. It is not a dated or irrelevant message, but one that is sharp today and for all eternity. However, for it to impact our lives, we must spend time in it.) God's Word always requires a response. How did James illustrate this point for us? Why should we never walk away from time in God's Word without finding at least one way to apply it to our lives?
- **5)** Read James 1:26-27. You could summarize James's point here by saying that we are called to pure speech, loving care, and holy living. When we embrace these traits, how do we become a reflection of Him?
- 6) Pastor James Ross gave us three application points: (1) Share your <u>FAITH</u> with those who haven't <u>LISTENED</u>. (2) <u>SERVE</u> those who can't <u>SERVE</u> you back. (3) Say <u>YES</u> to the next <u>RIGHT</u> thing. Which of these three is the Holy Spirit impressing on your heart to focus on the most this upcoming week?
