DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Who do you relate to most in this story—Levi, the disciples, or the Pharisees? Why?
2. Why do you think Jesus chose someone like Levi to follow Him?
3. Who are the “Levis” in your life—people you tend to avoid or feel uncomfortable around?
4. What does it look like to be around sinners without becoming comfortable with sin?
5. What is one practical step you can take this week to live more like Jesus in this way?

Heart Level Reflection Questions

1. Who is someone you’ve quietly written off or avoided—and what might it look like to see them the way Jesus does?
2. If Jesus approached you the way He approached Levi, what would be hardest for you to leave behind?
3. Where in your life have you been more like the Pharisees—judging from a distance instead of engaging up close?
4. Do the people far from God in your life feel welcomed by you, or do they feel like they have to change before they belong?
5. Are you more comfortable being around “righteous” people, or stepping into messy places where real transformation is needed—and why?

Luke 5:31-32
