DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What stood out to you most from Jesus' list of blessings and woes in Luke 6? Why?
2. Why do you think Jesus calls people blessed who are poor, hungry, grieving, or rejected?
3. Which of the two lists (blessed or woe) do you think best describes most people in our culture? Why?
4. What are some things people tend to look to for comfort, security, or happiness instead of Jesus?
5. What is one way you can grow in depending on Jesus more this week?

Heart- Level Reflection Questions

1. When life feels difficult, where do you naturally turn for comfort—Jesus, people, possessions, distractions, or something else? Why?
2. Looking at Jesus' two lists in Luke 6, which warning or blessing feels most personal to you right now? Explain.
3. Have you ever experienced rejection, criticism, or exclusion because of your faith? How did it affect your relationship with Jesus?
4. What is something in your life that could quietly be becoming a “pseudo savior” — something you look to for security, peace, meaning, or identity instead of Christ?
5. If Jesus lovingly warned you about one area of misplaced trust in your life today, what do you think it might be?
