PART 4: HOW DO I GO DEEPER WITH GOD?

Ruth 3:1–13



MAIN IDEA

God invites us to move beyond simply receiving His blessings to experiencing a deeper relationship with Him. This will require trust and vulnerability.



SCRIPTURE

"I am your servant Ruth," she said. "Spread the corner of your garment over me, since you are a guardian-redeemer of our family."

– *Ruth 3:9*



PRAYER

Lord, thank You for inviting me into a relationship with You that goes far beyond what I could earn or imagine. Give me courage to trust You completely and to bring my emptiness to you so you can fill it. Amen.

OVERVIEW

Naomi encourages Ruth to go to Boaz and ask him to act as her redeemer. Ruth takes a bold step of faith. She places herself in Boaz's hands, trusting that he will do what is right. This moment reveals a deeper truth: God invites us into an intimate relationship with Him through trust and vulnerability, and He is able to fill every emptiness in our lives.

KEY POINTS

1

THERE IS NO FUTURE WITHOUT A REDEEMER.

Ruth 3:1–5

Naomi saw that there was something better than merely working in Boaz's field. There was Boaz himself. God's greatest gift is not merely His provision, but Himself.

2

THERE IS NO TRUE INTIMACY WITHOUT VULNERABILITY.

Ruth 3:6–13

Ruth placed herself in Boaz's hands and asked him to act as her redeemer. Likewise, deeper intimacy with Christ requires trusting Him with every part of our lives.

THERE IS NO EMPTINESS THE REDEEMER CANNOT FILL.

Ruth 3:9–13

Ruth approached Boaz empty and vulnerable. She left with hope and a future. Jesus still fills lives that come to Him in humble dependence.



QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- 1 Where do you most need the Redeemer to fill what feels empty in your life today?
- 2 Is there an area of your life where Jesus is inviting you to trust Him more deeply instead of relying on your own strength?
