WEEK 1: CHRIST: GOD'S LAST WORD

HEBREWS 1:1-4; 2:1-4

Jesus is God's last Word—greater than every previous revelation.



MAIN IDEA

Jesus is the clearest and greatest depiction of God given to humankind. Because He is greater than every other word we are called to listen to Him, trust Him and follow Him.

KEY POINTS

1

Jesus is not one voice among many. He is God's revelation – The final "Word."

2

As God's revelation and final "Word," Jesus is not information, but salvation itself.

3

If Jesus is God's final Word and salvation, we must listen to Him and follow Him.

2. What does the author mean when he urges readers to 'pay the most careful attention to what we have heard,' in Hebrews 2:1?
3. In what ways is Jesus shown to be greater than the angels (Hebrews 1:4)?
4. What are some practical ways we can "listen to Him, trust Him, and follow Him" this week?



PERSONAL REFLECTION

- What truth from this passage speaks most to your heart right now?
- Is there anything God is asking you to believe, trust, or obey in light of what you've learned?
