## Lord of the Sabbath — Lesson 7

Key Scriptures: Matthew 12:1–8

Lesson Theme:

Jesus is Lord of the Sabbath and calls us to show mercy rather than rigidly following traditions.

## Summary

The Sabbath was instituted to commemorate God's creation and deliverance of Israel from Egypt, but over time it became burdened by legalistic rules. In Matthew 12, Jesus is confronted by the Pharisees for allowing His disciples to pluck grain on the Sabbath. He responds by teaching that He is greater than David, the Temple, and even sacrifice, showing His authority as the Lord of the Sabbath.
