Prayer Points

Stand Firm in Truth

Pray that God gives you the courage to stand firm in proclaiming Jesus as the only way, even when the world calls it intolerant.

Reflect Christ's Compassion

Ask God to help you speak truth with grace—so your tone reflects His love as much as your words reflect His truth.

Reject Relativism

Pray for discernment to recognize and reject the subtle lies of cultural relativism, holding fast to God's absolute truth.

Confess Jesus as Lord

Thank God for revealing Himself through Jesus Christ. Declare His Lordship over every area of your life.

Share the Gospel Boldly

Ask the Holy Spirit to open doors and hearts for you to share the message that Jesus is not one of many ways, but the way to eternal life.

Getting to Know You

1. List one thing you believed as a child or in your youth that turned out not to be true.

Digging Deeper

- 1. Read, Matthew 7:13-14, John 14:5-7, and Roman 10:14-17. When Jesus said He is "the way, the truth, and the life," what did he mean by "the way"? What is so significant in Jesus' calling Himself the way? How is His way different from all other religious paths? What is significant about "the Way" being a relationship, not a religion?
- 2. Read Judges 21:25, Isaiah 45:19, John 18:37-38, John 3:19-21, John 8:32, and Romans 1:18-19. What do people usually mean when they say, "Truth is relative"? Discuss the possibility of two opposing beliefs being true at the same time. What happens in society when everyone decides their own version of the truth? Why do people prefer the idea of relative truth instead of believing in absolute truth?
- 3. Read Isaiah 43:11, Acts 4:12, Romans 10:9-13, and 1Timothy 2:5-6. What is significant about the fact that anyone who calls on the name of the Lord can be saved? How does that balance the exclusivity of Christ being the only way with the inclusivity of the offer? How would you respond to the following statement: "A loving God wouldn't exclude sincere followers of other religions." In what ways does Jesus' being the only mediator bring both exclusivity and comfort?

Taking It Home

1. Think of a situation this week where you might be tempted to stay silent about the truth because it feels unpopular. What practical steps can you take this week to share Christ with someone who may be walking the "wide road"?
