# **CHRIS NUNN**



### **Powerful Deliverance**

Ask God to free you from anything that holds you captive and to give you boldness to stand firm in faith.

### Posture of Praise

Pray that you develop a heart of worship, choosing to praise God even in the midst of trials.

### Personal Belief

Ask God to strengthen your faith and to help you be ready to share the gospel with those who are seeking Him.

### **Purpose Behind Pain**

Pray that God would use your suffering for His glory, bringing transformation and salvation to those around you.

### Joy in Trials

Ask God to help you find true joy in Him, trusting that He is working all things for your good, even in difficult seasons.



# · PERSONAL STUDY-

### Powerful Deliverance (Acts 16:16-24)

Paul and Silas were imprisoned after casting a demon out of a slave girl, showing that opposition often follows obedience. Yet, true deliverance is found in Jesus alone, not just from physical chains but from spiritual bondage.

**Something to think about**: Have you ever faced opposition because of your faith? How did you respond?

# Posture of Praise (Acts 16:25-26)

Instead of despairing in their suffering, Paul and Silas worshiped, demonstrating that praise is a weapon that shifts our focus from problems to God's power. Their worship led to a miraculous breakthrough.

Something to think about: How can worship shift your focus from problems to God's power?

### Personal Belief (Acts 16:27-32)

Paul and Silas' suffering led to the salvation of the jailer and his family, proving that God can use even our trials for His glory. Our response to hardship can become a powerful witness to others.

**Something to think about**: If someone asked you how to be saved, how would you explain it?

# Purpose Behind Pain (Acts 16:33-34)

Paul and Silas teach us that joy is not dependent on circumstances but on Christ. When we trust that God is working in all things, we can rejoice even in suffering.

**Something to think about**: Can you think of a time when God used your suffering for a greater purpose?

# LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS



### **Getting to Know You**

1. Describe a time when you had to stand up for something that resulted in opposition or personal loss. How did you handle it? What would you do differently if you could?

### **Digging Deeper**

- 1. Read Ecclesiastes 3:1, Matthew 12:43-45, Mark 1:23-26, Acts 16:16-18, 2 Corinthians 11:14-15, Ephesians 6:12, 1 John 4:1. What do these passages teach us about spiritual oppression and deliverance? What does this teach us about discernment? Why did Paul wait "many days" before casting out the spirit? The slave girl was speaking the truth about Paul and Silas. Why was Paul troubled by her words?
- 2. Read Habakkuk 3:17-18, Matthew 5:16, Acts 16:25-28, 2 Corinthians 5:14-15, Colossians 3:16 and 1 Thessalonians 5:16-19. Why were Paul and Silas able to pray and sing hymns despite their suffering? What impact did their worship have on the other prisoners? Even though the earthquake opened all the doors and loosened chains, Paul and Silas did not escape. What does this teach us about trusting in God?
- 3. Read Luke 19:8-9, Luke 23:44-48, John 16:8, Acts 16:27-34, James 2:17, and 1 Peter 2:12. What did the jailer see that demonstrated that the gospel was true and that he needed salvation? What are some additional ways that have brought people to repentance? How did the jailer's actions and Zacchaeus reflect the transformation through salvation?

# Taking It Home

1. What does the passage in Acts teach us about the relationship between worship and breakthrough? Describe a time when worship helped you through a difficult situation. How can you grow in times of worship this week?
