

Getting to Know You:

- 1. What literary devices, symbolism, or metaphors have you seen in books, movies, plays, or television? How do they help to move the story forward and illuminate the plot?
- 2. What comes to mind when you hear about Lent, Ash Wednesday, or fasting? What residual bias or anxiety are you holding onto that could cause you to resist participating?
- 3. What are you most eager to discover in this series about the typologies of the Cross leading up to our Easter (Resurrection) celebrations?

Digging Deeper:

- 1. As you read Jonah 3:5-8, Joel 1:14, Esther 4:15-16, Ezra 8:21-23, Daniel 1:8-13 and Acts 13:2-3 what principles and purposes of fasting do you discover? How is Biblically correct fasting different from dieting, asceticism, and other forms of self-denial?
- 2. Look at the power evoked by Hannah's prayer in 1 Samuel 1:10-20 and Elijah's Prayer in 1 Kings 18:36-39 then look at how Paul prayed for the Ephesians in 3:14-21. How does a Spirit-filled prayer life enable us to intercede for others and illicit change in our circumstances and community? As you consider your answer, read 2 Chronicles 7:14.

Taking it Home:

- 1. What obstacle or hindrance to your spiritual walk with Christ has this study brought to mind that you are now willing to address and surrender? How will you incorporate prayer and fasting into your determination to overcome it?
- 2. Has prayer become a ritual lately or felt like a task to check off your to-do list? What will you do to break the monotony and once again communicate with your Savior passionately, powerfully, and purposefully?

Memory Verse

"Do to others as you want them to do to you." Luke 6:31. NIrV

Bible Story

Mary and Martha Luke 10:38-42

Bottom Line

Take time to show others they are important.

Use this guide to help your family learn about respect.

Activity

Mime Time

What You Need:

Writing utensil and paper

What You Do:

Invite your child to play a game with you. Say, "I'm going to call out an action. When I name the action, you act it out!"

Call out the following actions below. After you call out each action, allow your child to act it out. Feel free to add in any actions that might personalize the game for your family.

- read your Bible
- give a high-five
- play a game with your brother or
- pray
- help the grown-ups bring in the groceries
- help a friend clean their room
- give a hug
- listen respectfully in class
- sit and listen to a Bible story
- invite someone to sit with you

Choose a few actions to switch roles with your child, and let them call out actions for you to act out.

When you're finished playing, say, "What do all those actions have in common? (Pause to let your child try to guess.) They're all actions that would show others that they are important. Our story today reminds us to take time to show others they are important."

Talk About the Bible Story

Who in our story today showed Jesus that He was important? (Mary)

What did she do to show Jesus He was important? (She sat at His feet and listened to what He was saying.)

What are some ways you can be like Mary and spend time with Jesus, even though He's not here physically with us?

Of all the things we acted out, what are two or three of those actions that you can do this week to show others they are important?

Parent: Talk about a time when someone took the time to show you that you were important. What did they do, and how did it make you feel?





Praver

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"Dear God, it's amazing to think that You want to spend time with us! When Mary sat at Jesus' feet to listen to Him, He said that what she was doing was MOST important. Wow! This week, Lord, help us be like Mary and take time to show others they are important. Help us take time to show our friends they're important. Help us take time to show our family here in this home that they're important. In Jesus' name we pray, amen."

Bible Story

Love Your Enemies Matthew 5:43-47

Key Question

When is it hard to get along with someone?

Activity

Basket of Respect

What You Need:

Grab a few sheets of paper each for yourself and for your child.

Say, "There will be times in your life when it's difficult to show respect to someone you don't get along with. The same is true for me—even though I'm an adult.

"Let's write down the initials of people we've had trouble respecting because we don't get along. I won't look at what you write down, and you won't look at what I write down. As soon as we write down the person's initials, we'll crumple up the paper in a ball."

After you write down a set of initials, crumple up the paper. When finished, both of you stand 10 steps away from the empty trash can and take turns trying to throw your paper balls into the can.

For the second round, change the rules to make it easier and only stand five steps away from the trash can.

Talk About the Bible Story

How did Jesus show respect for other people? (He loves everyone; He treated everyone well, no matter who they were)

If an adult is hard for you to get along with, who can you go to for help so that you don't make things worse by being disrespectful?

What can you do if you feel like there's someone who's not respecting YOU?

Is it possible to not like someone but still show them respect? Why or why not?

Parent: Talk about how God's Spirit has helped you show respect to someone, even when you didn't get along. Maybe God helped you SPEAK kind words to someone who spoke rudely to you . . . or maybe God helped you DO something kind for a difficult coworker. Maybe God helped you remember to PRAY for someone who cut in front of you.



Prayer

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"Dear God, help us remember how important it is to show respect to other people—even when they're hard to get along with. Please help us not to be difficult to get along with. Remind us that following You and treating others the way we want to be treated is way cooler than putting others down or saying things that are disrespectful. We need Your help to do the opposite of what we sometimes feel like doing when we're angry or hurt. In Jesus' name we pray, amen."
