# PRAYER POINTS:

# **Identify and Remove Idols**

Ask God to reveal anything in your life that has taken His place and give you the strength to remove it.

# Develop a Heart for the Lost

Pray that you would see people as God sees them and be moved to share the gospel with boldness.

# Trust in God's Sovereignty

Ask God to deepen your trust in His control over your life, history, and the world around you.

# **Embrace True Repentance**

Pray that your heart would be fully surrendered to God, turning from sin and walking in obedience.

# **Live Out Your Faith Boldly**

Ask God to empower you to be a doer of the Word, actively living and sharing your faith in Christ.



# · PERSONAL STUDY-

The Condition of Athens (Acts 17:16-21)
Paul was deeply disturbed by the idolatry he saw in Athens and felt compelled to respond.

Something to think about: What aspects of today's culture provoke your spirit, and how should you respond as a follower of Christ?

Paul's Approach to Evangelism (Acts 17:22-29) Paul used the Athenians' altar to an "unknown god" as a starting point to share the gospel in a way they could understand.

**Something to think about:** How can you find common ground when sharing your faith with others who don't yet know Christ?

The Call to Repentance (Acts 17:30-31)
Paul boldly proclaimed that God calls all people to repent because judgment is coming.

Something to think about: What does true repentance look like in your daily life, and where is God calling you to turn back to Him?

Responses to the Gospel (Acts 17:32-34 The people of Athens reacted in different ways—some mocked, some delayed, and some believed.

**Something to think about:** How do people today respond to the message of Christ, and how do you personally handle moments of conviction?

# **Getting to Know You:**

1. How did you come to Christ? What was it that convinced you Christianity was true?

# **Digging Deeper:**

- 1. Read Acts 17:16-17 and 2 Peter 2:6-8 about Paul and Lot, who both were provoked by the wickedness surrounding them. Study the life of Lot and the decisions he made in Genesis 13:1-13, Genesis 14:12, and Genesis 19:12-38. Where did he compromise, and what was the end result? According to 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 and 2 Timothy 4:6-8, how did Paul live differently, and what was his fruit? What can you take away from this?
- 2. Read Acts 17:16-34 and consider how different Paul's approach to witnessing was to Peter's in Acts 2:14-36. Why would Peter use Scripture and Paul use poets? Is it important to understand the background and beliefs of the lost when witnessing? Why? How would you tailor your message to an atheist as opposed to a non-observant catholic?
- 3. Read Romans 1:18-23, Romans 2:12-16, Acts 17:24-30, and Acts 14:15-17 and discuss what people can know about God apart from the Scripture. For instance, what attributes of God can be seen in creation? What can we discern about God's moral law through our conscience? Then, consider what is revealed about God only through Scripture.

# **Taking it Home:**

1. Have you witnessed to anyone lately? How do you feel it went? What approach did you use? After this study, should you try a different approach?
