

# **Getting to Know You:**

- 1. What are some of the ways you tried to beat the summer heat when you were growing up? Did you run through the sprinklers, go swimming in a pool, or were you more likely to drink a tall lemonade in front of the air conditioner?
- 2. Is your perception of the passage of time relative to the activity and the value of the result? For example, compare your patience when waiting in line at a theme park versus the DMV. Contrast your experience at a fine restaurant to waiting for the microwave to ding. Relate that idea to your endurance when waiting for God to deliver you from times of suffering or discipline. What would make the wait seem easier?
- 3. Picture a guy pulling his carry-on roller bag down an aisle running over several people's feet as he goes. Each time he rolls over a foot, he says, "sorry." When he gets to your feet, will you accept his apology? How can you tell the difference between a superficial apology and sincere repentance?

# **Digging Deeper:**


- 1. Read Hosea 6:1-3 and compare it with John 15:1-2, Psalms 119:67-71, and Hebrews 2:10. Why does God allow suffering in our lives? What are some of the things God can accomplish in us through our afflictions?
- 2. Read Hosea 6:2-3 and expound what it looks like in a believer's life to be 'revived,' 'raised up,' and see 'God coming like the spring rain' as you also consider John 4:14, John 10:10, Galatians 5:22-23. What can limit us from experiencing all that God has for us?
- 3. Read Hosea 6:6 and then compare it with Jesus' remarks in Matthew 9:9-13 and Matthew 12:1-8. How does Jesus interpret the statement, "I desire mercy and not sacrifice?" How did the Pharisees miss the point; how do we often still miss it today?

# Taking it Home:

- 1. Think of prior periods of suffering or pruning in your life and evaluate how you reacted to God. How will you respond better in the future?
- 2. Share a story about when God has refreshed your spirit. Compare that with a time when you felt spiritually dry. What do you think are some of the things that affected the different outcomes? What might lead to more refreshing times and fewer seasons of dryness?
- 3. Examine your life and consider where you could have been more compassionate and merciful. Take a minute to ask God for help as you choose to improve. What will you use as an indicator to gauge your growth or regression in that goal?

# Read Ecclesiastes 4:9

Playing catch or "Hide and Seek" Riding on a seesaw Talking on a pair of walkie talkies

These things require more than one person! If you hopped on a seesaw by yourself, you'd just sit there with one end up in the air. If you picked up a walkie talkie with no one on the other end, your conversation wouldn't last very long.

That's why two are truly better than one! Not only can you get more done, you can have way more fun with a friend along for the ride. What if we practiced cooperation? What if we worked on working together to make it a habit?

### Verse Friends

- Show today's verse to a friend and challenge them to memorize it with you.
- 2. Grab a ball and head outside.
- Toss the ball back and forth as you repeat the words of the verse.
- If one of you drops the ball, start back at the beginning of the verse.
- Repeat until you can both say the verse from memory.

# Read John 13:35

When Jesus started His ministry, do you know what Hedid first? Did He start a YouTube channel to get His message out and reach thousands of new followers? Nope. Instead, Jesus did something super important. He recruited twelve apostles to travel with Him and help Him in His ministry.

Was Jesus powerful enough to do what He needed to do without these men? Absolutely! But He chose to cooperate, to work with these men to change the whole world. He wanted those disciples to love others the way He loved them. That same message is for those of us who follow Jesus today. When we love others the way He loves us, when we cooperate with other believers around us to share this same message, we can reach more people.

Ask God to help you cooperate this week and love those three the way Jesus loves you.

# Read Proverbs 27:17

Have you ever noticed how a marker can bleed on to your hands or table? As you think about that marker rubbing off on your hand, reread this verse. The way we treat others, the way we cooperate, has the potential to "rub off" on the people around us. When we choose to work together, when we listen to another person's ideas, hopefully those things will "rub off" on the people around us! And when we do, we not only get more done, we can help others succeed.

### Marker Maker

- Grab an index card and write out the words from today's verse on the card.
- 2. Don't let the marker "ink" dry and see how much marker rubs off on your hands!
- Ask God to help you cooperate this week so that you can help others succeed.
