

The Day the Revolution Began

Luke 23:44-24:12

LifeGroup Discussion Guide

Opening:

- Welcome everyone to the group!
- Go around the group and have each person share their name and one Easter memory or tradition they enjoy.
- Ask: What stood out to you in Sunday's message?

Scripture:

Luke 23:44-24:12 (NLT or preferred translation)

Consider asking one or more in the group to read the passage aloud

Discussion Questions:

- Brian shared how the silence of Saturday—the day between Jesus' death and resurrection
 —can feel like the hardest part of the story. Have you ever experienced a 'Saturday
 season' in your life? What did it feel like? What did you learn through it?
- What does it mean to you personally that the resurrection is not just a one-time event but the beginning of God's ongoing revolution of love and restoration?

- N.T. Wright says, 'The revolution began on a Friday afternoon.' How does that reframe the way you view the cross and the resurrection?
- In what ways do you see God bringing resurrection life in your own life, family, workplace, or community?
- Are there any 'graves'—places of shame, fear, sin, or disappointment—you feel God calling you to step out of?
- How can our group support one another in joining God's resurrection revolution here in Frederick and beyond?

Prayer:

- Ask: What do you need prayer for today as you seek to live into resurrection life?
- Spend time in prayer for one another, particularly around the areas people want to step into new life or resurrection.

Weekly Challenge:

This week, identify one way you can live as a 'resurrection person'—someone who brings life, hope, or healing to someone else. It could be an act of kindness, forgiveness, justice, or encouragement.
