A Ukraine refugee, Olena Shevliakova, arrived in South Dakota on December 20th and is staying with host family Ty and Jen Moos near Webster. Olena is from the city of Pavlograd. On April 30, 2023, after a night missile attack, her apartment suffered destruction and she was forced to leave Ukraine. She has a Master's degree in Primary Education, Lecturer of Pedagogy and Methods of Primary Education and been a Primary School Teacher for 12 years. A meet and greet is planned TODAY - Sunday morning January 7th at 9:30 am during coffee. We invite everyone to come out to meet Olena and welcome her to our community. She is currently seeking employment in Watertown and an apartment. To get her started in her new life, we will put together a list of items you can donate for her apartment. Stocking her food shelves and monetary donations are welcome as are gift cards for her to purchase items she will need in her first months. MISSION OF THE MONTH Ukrainian Refugee Efforts

During the past year, Grace Lutheran has sponsored 5 refugees from Ukraine. Vasyl Molod and Igor and Luv Tokariev and boys Davyd and Ramir. All have settled into their apartments, jobs, and school in Watertown.

Currently a new refugee, Olena Shevliakova, arrived in South Dakota on December 20th and is staying with host family Ty and Jen Moos at Webster. She will be moving to Watertown in the coming weeks as she obtains employment and an apartment.

The statewide "Freedom's Haven for New Americans Workforce" set a goal in 2023 of 1,000 Ukrainians for Watertown, SD. Winter is setting in hard in Ukraine, and Russia is targeting the electricity, water, and other infrastructure systems. Ukrainian's coming to the US must have a sponsor. Lutheran Social Service and Codington Country Social Services provide many programs of assistance. They are allowed to work as soon as they arrive in the US. Volunteer assistance is needed to provide transportation for the first weeks they are here so they can apply for employment. Currently there are 6 families plus two singles in Watertown and another family coming this month.

Grace Lutheran has a separate account to make donations for our refugees to help them get established as they come.
