Genesis 2: 8-9 18-22 Pew Bible p 2

⁸ And the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed.

⁹ Out of the ground the LORD God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. (Gen 2:8-9 NRS)

¹⁸ Then the LORD God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner."
