unemployment, business loss, broken relationship, life altering operations, family trauma or any type of loss. It is even more traumatic as COVID-19 seems to rear it's ugly head once more. A Blue Christmas service creates a safe place for those who struggle with loss or mourn a loved one. It is a time to join together with others burdened by grief for emotional encouragement and receive spiritual support. Any who have suffered this past year or continue to suffer from years gone by are welcome to come to this nondenominational service and hear God's word of hope and healing shine through the darkness calling you forward to the bright shining light of spring when new life returns.

### **MISSION OF THE MONTH – Grace Lutheran Christmas Dinner**

This month's Mission of the Month is the annual Grace Lutheran Christmas Dinner. Last year there were approximately 500 meals serve through delivers and carry out over the noon hour on Christmas Day. The meals start with planning the food and volunteer sign-up. Volunteers are needed for cooking: to prepare dished prior to the day and cook the day of Christmas. About 10 people are needed for cooking that day. There were 8 roasters of turkey and ham (4 of each) 15 gallons of salad; numerous pies made prior to the day, buns, mashed potatoes, dressing, gravy and corn. Volunteer Delivery drivers are needed to take the meals out to the people the day of Christmas. The more drivers there are the less time and trips it takes for the delivery. So we need a LOT of drivers. Volunteers to dish up the food into take-out containers. Each take-out consist of meat, dressing, mashed potatoes and gravy and corn plus a container of salad, a bun, and a container with pie. All are put into a bag and delivered to the people whether it is drive up or delivered. Clean up afterwards. Those who start cooking early in the morning appreciate fresh help to clean up after the hours of getting the meals out. If you are unable to help with these activities, you can always donate to the Christmas dinner as supplies are needed, to-go containers and food. This is a wonderful Christmas tradition put on by Grace Lutheran each year and a special service project for those who are alone at Christmas, have no family, or no longer cook a traditional meal. It truly shows how grace is experience here through the Mission and Ministry of Grace Lutheran. Worship service is at 10 am and serving begins at 11 am. Please consider giving to this gift.
