

ULTIMATE SACRIFICE



On March 30, 1981, President Ronald Reagan had just given a speech at the Washington Hilton Hotel. Something presidents have done regularly and without incident since 1972. Following his speech, the President walked out of the hotel surrounded by his Secret Service agents, one in front, one on each side and one behind him. As he approached his limousine, shots rang out. Six of them.

Instantly and instinctively, the agents did what they were trained to do: protect the President at all costs and get him out of danger as quickly as possible. Jerry Parr, agent in charge of the Presidential Protective Division pushed the President into the car while another agent, Timothy McCarthy, spread out his arms as a human shield. Both President Reagan and Agent Parr fell into the limo. Agent Ray Shaddick pushed their legs in and slammed the door behind them as the vehicle pulled away from the curb.

Looking back, Agent Parr saw three people down on the sidewalk outside the hotel. He would later learn that one of them was White House Press Secretary, James Brady, who had been hit in the head. The second was District of Columbia police officer, Thomas Delahanty, who was hit in the neck as he had moved to protect the President. Finally, Agent Timothy McCarthy, who had stretched himself out as a human shield to protect the President, had been struck in the abdomen.

President Reagan survived the assassination attempt by John Hinckley, who was found not guilty by reason of insanity and was released from a mental hospital in September 2016. All the others survived their wounds although their lives would forever be changed by the events of that day. Agent Parr tells of helping the President into George Washington University Hospital and that he collapsed once he'd stepped inside. He was unconscious and pale as workers rushed him into the ER. Agent Parr said he prayed silently, "Lord, let him live! Lord, let him live!" over and over again.

In a USA TODAY article (March 30, 2011), Agent Jerry Parr said, "Thirty years later, I look back on that historic day and know for certain that his life was saved by dedicated agents, excellent training, good equipment, outstanding medical care, President Reagan's robust constitution – and the grace of God." Agent Parr retired in 1985.

As great a sacrifice as that was in 1981, there was an even greater sacrifice made over 2,000 years ago.

This time, instead of being outside of a Washington, D.C. hotel, the scene took place outside the city of Jerusalem ... on a hillside overlooking the city. Once again, an amazing man stretched out His arms as a human shield. But this time it wasn't to protect a president. This time it was to protect you ... and me. The name of this amazing man?

JESUS.

The Bible says, "He was wounded for our transgressions. He was bruised for our iniquities" (<u>Isaiah 53:5</u>). Paul said, "For our sake God made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God" (<u>2</u> <u>Corinthians 5:21</u>).

Somehow, saying, "thank you!" seems woefully inadequate for what Jesus did back then and what He's still doing for all of us today. Somehow, even calling the day "Good Friday," as we will remember again next week, the price He paid when He spread out His arms and died in our place, doesn't seem good enough.

Maybe it should be called, "AWESOME Friday" or "INCREDIBLE Friday." Somehow, "Good Friday," doesn't adequately express what's in my heart ... for all He did for us on the cross.

How about you?

Your identity reveals your character and your destiny. Jesus' identity was questioned in Luke 9. Peter responded with a firm conviction of Jesus as the Christ. Jesus was able to support his claim by coming back to life after his death on the cross. After his resurrection, Jesus commissioned his followers to go into all the world and make disciples. In this series of exciting messages from Luke chapters 9-12 we will consider who Jesus is and how his identity affects us. Jesus is the Lord of all!

What Are You Afraid Of?

Read Psalm 56:3-4 (ESV)

When I am afraid, I put my trust in you. In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can flesh do to me?

Reflect

Are you feeling any fear right now? If so, what are you afraid of?

It is a fearful time for many. There are health concerns, economic issues, political unrest, and wars being fought throughout the world. Fear is a natural response to these things. But if we have put our trust in God and placed saving faith in Jesus Christ, we have nothing to fear!

That is what David was expressing in today's verse. David had a lot to be afraid of throughout his life. He was pursued by many enemies. Sometimes he had to fight for his life as a warrior and other times he had to run for his life and hide from those who wanted him dead.

When we read the beginning of this psalm, we gain some context for the fear that David was facing. He wrote, "Be gracious to me, O God, for man trampled on me; all day long an attacker oppresses me; my enemies trample on me all day long, for many attack me proudly" (Psalm 56:1-2). David was under attack by men. The title of the psalm identifies the incident David is lamenting as the time the Philistines seized him in Gath. You can read about it in 1 Samuel 21:10-15.

And yet, he confidently placed his trust in God. Why? Because he knew that men are limited in their ability to truly harm him. He was in God's hands. What could men of mere flesh and blood do to him? He belonged to the Almighty God!

I love how David ends <u>Psalm 56</u>. After lamenting over his trouble and pouring out his fear to God, he turns to praise. Even before God intervened. His circumstances hadn't changed. Still, he thanked God in advance. He wrote: "This I know, that God is for me. In God, whose word I praise, in the Lord, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid, what can man do to me? I must perform my vows to you, O God; I will render thank offerings to you. For you have delivered my soul from death, yes, my feet from falling, that I may walk before God in the light of life" (<u>Psalm 56:9b-13</u>).

In Matthew 10:28-32, Jesus Himself confirmed that we shouldn't fear anything that can take our mortal lives but not our eternal souls: "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven."

Friends, if you have acknowledged Jesus Christ as Lord and placed your faith in Him for your salvation, He won't deny you. You belong to Him. You are valuable to Him. He even knows the number of hairs on your head. Covid or any other disease could take your life. Our country could fall apart. We could lose our jobs and struggle to pay our bills and feed our families. World war 3 could start. But none of that changes our eternal destiny. Those things can kill our bodies but they have no claim to our souls. It's ok to be afraid. It's a scary world out there. But let's do like David did. When we are afraid, let's put our trust in the Lord. After all, what can this world do to you?

Pray

Lord, there is so much in the world that scares me. And yet, I know that I belong to You. You watch over me so closely that the hairs on my head are all counted. So I thank You and praise You, God. I put my trust in You because I know that You have delivered my soul from death. The world can't hurt me. Amen.

Watching the American Sign Language Version of the Bible in Three Months!

Have you ever read through or watched the entire Bible in one year? How about six months? Students in Jamaica are going to watch the entire American Sign Language Version of the Bible (ASLV) in three months! Read what our friend Carole and her team are planning to accomplish:

Thank you for all that you do and are doing partnering with God in so many amazing ways! Today my heart is so FULL of THANKFULNESS for you and the whole team at Deaf Missions who made the ASLV possible! I know it took 38 years with so many people. THANK YOU for continuing the dream of Duane King to completion.

Today, our YWAM Deaf World Jamaica community is starting a CRAZY but FUN journey of watching the WHOLE ASLV in three months! YWAM has a training program called Discipleship Bible School (DBS) which is a program after the Discipleship Training School (DIS). The DIS is all about how to have a relationship with God and share with him others. The Bible school is all about understanding God's story and being able to observe, interpret, apply and communicate it accurately. Part of the requirement of the DBS is the 'read' the Bible cover to cover. AND BECAUSE OF DEAF MISSIONS AND THE ASLV we can 'watch' it all the way through!

Caleb one of our Deaf staff is pioneering the first ever Deaf World DBS with 10 students. And they started 'watching' today and will be watching everyday at 1.5 speed for the next 14 weeks to complete it all! I think we might be the first program/school to watch it all together as a group in



three months. Have you heard of another group that has watched the whole ASLV together from Genesis to Revelation? We are a little crazy but wow I am so excited about 12 of us (10 students and 2 staff) devouring God's word together this season and seeing how He transforms our lives!!

As we start today, my heart just was so full and thankful for you that I wanted to write a short message. THANK YOU again for all the work you have done to make this possible! I know that you are doing the same thing now for the Jesus movie.
