You're Gonna Love This!



"When Noah sailed the waters blue, he had his troubles same as you. For forty days he drove the ark, until he found a place to park."

The author of that poem took some obvious liberties as far as **Noah** *looking for a place to park*. But he hit the nail on the head in regard to Noah being like us.

How many times do you suppose people pick up a Bible and try to read it and think to themselves, "There's no way this relates to me ... I'm not like these people."

For example, we can't imagine some Bible character struggling to make a mortgage payment, or having rebellious children, or having a huge stack of monthly bills and a puny paycheck.

So many struggle to understand, although times are very different, people are basically the same.

You might be interested to know **MOSES** struggled for quite some time while working for his father-in-law, **JETHRO**. **ADAM** and **EVE** most likely had to change diapers. After all, the entire human race began with them, and I'll bet whatever they used was nothing compared to what we have today!

ELIJAH struggled economically during times of intense famine. **DAVID**, a king in Israel, struggled with lust and adultery. A very talented but troubled man named **NEBUCHADNEZZAR** had an ego problem that cost him everything. **ABRAHAM** lied on several occasions. So did his son, **ISAAC. PETER**, one of the most prominent followers of **JESUS**, was known to have a problem with cursing and swearing.

The **SAMARITAN WOMAN** had been married and divorced numerous times and was living with a man who was not her husband when she encountered

the Lord. **JONAH** is remembered even today for his rebellious spirit and disobedient lifestyle which led to the biggest "fish story" you've ever heard. (Yet, it's true!)

The stories of each of these people are found in the pages of the Bible. And it doesn't matter who you point to, they are basically the same as people today. They struggled just like we do and had to deal with problems just like we do.

That's what makes the Bible so unique. God has provided "real-life" examples of people **JUST LIKE US**, so we can profit from their pain, learn from their losses, avoid their mistakes and failures and use their stories as steppingstones for our own success.

The Bible isn't a collection of feel-good stories that make for good late-night reading when you can't sleep or simply for soothing verses to be read at someone's funeral. Rather, it is one continuous story that tells the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth about people's real-life struggles with temptation, sin, the devil, people, problems, kids, families, finances, you name it.

When we take the time to read the whole story and learn from it, we can rewrite our own story for eternity.

In a world of increasing uncertainty, insecurity, and hopelessness, we have a place we can go for answers.

So, whatever your problem is today, I know just the book to help you. It's called the **BIBLE**.

It has been pretty quiet around here . . . too quiet if you ask me. Hey, I know we are all pretty busy with life in general, but we have got to find a way to make some noise for the Lord. Let's be the disciples God has called us to be.

How? That's a great question. Let's put on our creative thinking caps, dust off our Bibles, and go to work. Here are a few ideas.

- 1. Put together a Bible reading plan group. Get some friends and strangers (*soon to be friends*), pick a bible reading plan, get together and read the through the plan together. You can do it over morning coffee, pick an evening at your home, or take advantage of a free afternoon at the church. Put one together at an assisted living facility or nursing home. The possibilities are limitless.
- 2. Establish a group of people (*friends and strangers*) with a common interest such as walking, hiking, hunting, archery, sewing, crafting, reading, movies, farming, gardening, writing, traveling, exploring, fishing, theater, singing, cooking, collecting, history, genealogy, and whatever other hobby or interest you enjoy. Schedule some activities for both enjoyment and service and include some devotions, prayer, and/or some kind of book study. Enjoy your interest while you connect with others and the Lord.
- 3. Maybe you are at a particular stage in your life that you need encouragement and support from others in the same stage of life. Are you empty nesters, retirees, senior citizen, young adult, parents of teens, parents of small children? Imagine what a group of Christ followers in these stages could do for each other and how they can reach out to others in the same boat who are not yet Christ followers.
- 4. Host a Christian book study and invite your friends and neighbors. You can host it anywhere you like at anytime you like. Most book studies come with study guides. The goal of most book studies is to build relationships through discussion and discovering common ground all while finding out how God plays important roles in our lives. As a host you don't have to have all the answers. You are the facilitator.
- 5. Establish your own in person prayer circle. I know we have a prayer chain here at First Church of Christ but how much more powerful would prayers be in a circle of friends in person. You could meet daily, weekly, monthly, or quarterly with the one and sole purpose of prayer. You could pick a theme, topic, person, community, or any specific prayer for the day, week, month or year and focus on prayers related to your choices.
- 6. You are never too old to learn or explore. Find some people who want to learn something new with you, find a person to teach it to you, and then go out and learn it as a group. Then put what you learn to use and pick another learning or exploration project.
- 7. Become a mentor to young people. For example, you could come to Bible Buddies and sit next to a Bible Buddies student while they are learning about the Lord and answer any questions they have or just listen to them tell you stories about themselves.
- 8. Become a mentor in the community. Do you have a specific skill or know how to do something really well that others might like to learn? Offer a class or workshop about it to the community, your friends, and neighbors. Share the knowledge and skills that God graciously gave to you with others. Some examples might be cooking for singles or couples, budgeting, basic wiring, basic car maintenance, basic home maintenance, computer software, writing, singing, playing an instrument. Here the possibilities are endless as well. Don't keep all that savvy to yourself.

So what's it going to be my friends? Where do you want to start? What are your ideas? Let's get busy!

Knowing Love

Read Ephesians 3:18-19

...may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with the fullness of God.

Reflect

What impact does growing in your relationship with Christ have on your love for Him?

When my wife and I first got married, I thought I loved her. And I did! But I soon realized that even though I thought I knew her well, there were always new things that I was discovering about her the longer we were married. Now that we've been married for almost 40 years, my love for her has grown immensely. I thought I couldn't love her more than I did on our wedding day, but I was wrong!

The same is true in our relationship with Christ. The more we get to know Him, the more we love Him. In today's passage, Paul is praying for the Ephesians. His prayer is that they would be able to comprehend how vast God's love is for all who are in Christ. Paul points out that the love of Christ "surpasses knowledge." As finite human beings, we will never be

able to fully grasp how much Jesus loves us. As a child, we can sing "Jesus love me, this I know" and believe that it is true. But we fail to fully grasp the concept.

The longer I walk with Jesus, the more I understand the deep love that He has for me. But at the same time, the more I know about Jesus, the more I marvel at His love and fail to fully comprehend it. It is astounding to me to know that I will never, ever be able to fully grasp the love of Christ. But I plan to spend the rest of my life trying to.

I can say with confidence that the more I know Christ and how much He loves me, the more I love Him. Friends, as the leadership of First Church of Christ, we are praying the same for you. We are praying that the Holy Spirit fills you up and gives you the strength to continue to grow in your understanding of Jesus's unfathomable love for you which in turn will strengthen and deepen your love for Him.

BOARD OF ELDERS & DEACONS UPDATE

Board Meeting Notes February 6, 2022

- Under ministry reports the Prayer Chain was the topic of discussion. Mary Hasbrouck wants to step down from being the primary intake person. Nancy Nelson asked if the board could come up with a plan for the interim until a new intake person would step forward. David Hall suggested checking into a telephone tree message system. It was also suggested to call for a volunteer in the newsletter. A final suggestion was to target a couple of key people to take certain parts of the Prayer Chain. No action was taken at this time.
- Under Mission Reports it was reported that the Mission team will meet on February 11, 2022, at 2 p.m. with plans to set up a display table to highlight the Voice of the Martyrs mission for the first quarter. The board also asked that the team discuss possibly adding the Cherokee County Ministerial Association back to our missions list since they are meeting again.
- Under Fellowship Easter services were brought up in discussion. David is considering a sunrise service. Jews for
 Jesus will be here on April 12th for a special presentation. There was some discussion about a Good Friday
 service, but no action was taken at this time. The leadership will again present a breakfast prior to worship
 services on Easter Sunday. Sermons Ala Carte is also being presented this year with David presenting a sermon
 on March 23rd.
- Under Worship the elders were approached with concerns about the service time beginning at 9:00 a.m. as it was voted for at the congregational meeting. After some discussion Larry Heschke motioned to leave the service at 9:00 a.m. as that was how the majority voted at the annual meeting. Barry Nelson seconded the motion. The motion carried.
- David Hall brought up the idea of getting a new wireless head worn microphone system but said he will wait until finances were better. He also let the board know that he would like to purchase an update pulpit. He would prefer to have something where he can preach from the middle of the stage rather than off to the side without interfering with the view of the worship team. David shared a photo of an example of what he was thinking about. Action on these requests will be taken later when finances are better.
- Under Buildings and Grounds Kirk Nelson was checking with SCE about scooping the sidewalk since it had not
 been done that last time it snowed. Normally this is done by volunteers. Kirk was not present to share what he
 found out. Barry Nelson said he would talk to his son Benjamin Nelson about maybe stopping at the church first
 and blowing off the cement before going onto their normal snow removal customers. The main issue is getting it
 done before SCE comes with their equipment. It could have been a new employee who did not know to back
 drag the cement prior to clearing off the rest of the parking lot.
- The most recent MidAmerican Energy bill was about three times the normal amount. The board new natural gas prices were going to go up and accounted for it in the recent budget proposal.
- Under old business Larry Heschke asked Mike Rose at Valley Glass to go ahead and order the new door for the lower-level southwest entrance. We will have to follow up and make sure he orders it. Getting the old door out will take some planning and warmer weather.
- The board instructed Nancy to place a call for greeting volunteers for Sunday morning worship in the newsletter so we can get back to greeting people prior to worship. They also ask that she publish the Thanksgiving meal results in the newsletter as a member of the congregation requested.
- The next board meeting will be March 13, 2022, following Bible classes. It will also be daylight savings time.


This six week study will be held on Sunday evenings afternoons at 4 p.m. beginning March 13, 2022. This will be the six weeks leading up to Easter Sunday.
