

Seven Ways to Prepare for Easter



Easter weekend is the SUPER BOWL for saints. The FINAL FOUR for followers of Christ and the WORLD SERIES for those who are serious about what JESUS did for us over 2,000 years ago. We're celebrating the single greatest event in all of human history: The RESURRECTION of JESUS from the grave.

So what's the best way to get ready for it?

(1) PRAY. Perhaps the most underrated aspect of the Christian life is prayer. None of us pray as much as we could or should. Certainly the celebration of Easter, centered on the death, burial and resurrection, should call for extended times of prayer, thanking God for the blessings He has given us.

(2) PROMOTE. Peter and John were ordered not to speak or teach at all in the name of JESUS. Their response? "We cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). Surely those of us who have experienced the joy of salvation should share it with those who have not. In our current culture of bad news, 24-hours a day, the time has never been better for the GOOD NEWS. We should use whatever avenues of communication we can to spread the Word to everyone we know.

(3) PLAN. A preacher I know says, "What happens on Sunday is always a Saturday night decision." In other words, we plan ahead for the things that are important to us and worship ought to be number one. So make plans right now to be part of your church's EASTER celebration. Get it on your calendar. Tell your family and friends, "This is what we are going to do and when we are going to do it."

(4) PREPARE. A vital part of planning is preparing. It's not enough to have a plan if you don't make the preparations to execute it. I have a long-time habit of creating my "To-Do" list for the next day before I leave my office to go home for the evening. On Saturday evening, I put out the shirt I plan to wear to church the next day. The short answer on the shirt? If I want my wife to iron it, it needs to be out the night before. Make all the preparations you need to make so this year's Easter celebration can be your best ever.

(5) PROVIDE. A lot of people will head to Easter celebrations excited about what they are going to get out

of it and that's to be expected. However, as Christ-followers, shouldn't we also be prepared to give of ourselves to the One Who has given us everything? Easter weekend is the perfect opportunity to give a special gift. Lots of people spend money on new clothes for their kids, even themselves. Many will buy Easter gifts and do special things for friends and family. Let's make sure we give our best to the Lord and His Church, especially this EASTER weekend.

(6) PARTICIPATE. Unless you are physically sick or unable to come, don't let anything or anyone keep you from worshipping the RISEN LORD on EASTER WEEKEND.

(7) PRAISE. The Resurrection is the centerpiece of Christianity. It's mentioned 104 times in the New Testament and was the central theme to all of the apostolic preaching in Acts. Eleven of the 12 Apostles eventually died martyr's deaths on the basis of two things: the Resurrection of JESUS Christ and their belief in Him as the Son of God. The Resurrection is what sets Christianity apart from every other religion. One commentator said, "Just as the heart pumps life-giving blood to every part of the body, so the truth of the resurrection gives life to every other area of gospel truth."

According to Peter, because of the Resurrection of JESUS Christ, we have been born again with a living hope and an inheritance kept in heaven for us (1 Peter 1:3-4). The Apostle Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain." But the angel declared, "He is not here! He is risen, just as He said!" The tomb is empty and we have a reason to praise God and celebrate what JESUS has done like never before.

So get ready. Let's celebrate!

didn't have anything to gain for lying. Instead, they lost everything for speaking the truth!

But there were even more eyewitnesses of the risen Christ than just the 12 disciples. Paul explained, "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me" (1 Corinthians 15:3-8). He appeared to more than 500 people. And what's more, after He appeared to these eyewitnesses, their lives were transformed! For example, Paul encountered Jesus and he was never the same!

Our Faith Is Not Futile

Read 1 Corinthians 15:17-20 (ESV)

And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Reflect

If Jesus was never resurrected, what would be the point of Christianity?

Throughout the course of history, there have been many who have called the resurrection of Jesus into question and tried to disprove it. From day one, we see the chief priests and elders paying off the guards to spread the rumor that the disciples came and stole Jesus' body (Matthew 28:11-15).

But if the disciples stole the body, what did they do with it? Jesus' body has never been recovered. How did they get past the armed Roman soldiers that were guarding the tomb? How did they remove that heavy stone? Most convincingly, why were they willing to stick to this story even in the face of severe persecution? Remember, all of the disciples were persecuted for maintaining that Jesus rose from the grave. In fact, only John escaped martyrdom and died of natural consequences but even he had been severely persecuted and exiled to the island of Patmos. Does it make sense that all of these men would faithfully maintain a lie for all of those years only to die for it? They

In the above passage, Paul says that if Jesus has not been raised, we are still dead in our sins. Without the resurrection, we have no hope for life after death. In that case, our faith would be pointless. We would be people deserving of pity for foolishly believing something false and for dedicating our lives and even suffering for a lie!

And yet, it isn't a lie! We have every reason to believe that Jesus was bodily raised from the dead on the third day. Paul says that because Christ has been raised from the dead, we can have full assurance that we will be resurrected as well! In 1 Corinthians 15:22 he says, "For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive."

Friends, our faith is not futile! We are not the ones to be pitied! Rather, our hearts should break for those who are perishing in unbelief. We should dedicate our lives to sharing the Gospel with others so that they too may believe and be saved. In Christ, our debt is paid, our sins are forgiven, we are made right with the Father, we have the assurance of everlasting life, and we are transformed! We should share this Good News with others every chance we get!

Pray

Jesus, thank You for the incredible hope that we have in You. Your resurrection proves that You are one with the Father, just as You said. You have the power to forgive my sins and You will raise me up with You to live forever. Give me opportunities to share Your Good News with those who are lost and perishing in unbelief. Amen.



Board Meeting Notes March 13, 2022

Mission Reports

Worship

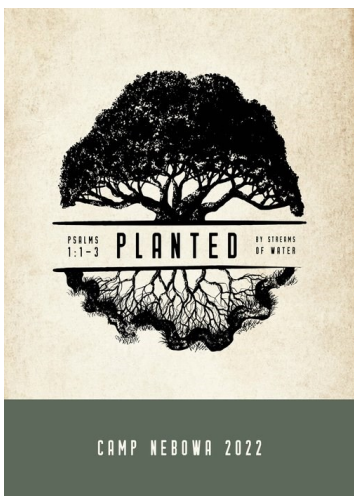
- David was asked again about the wireless head worn microphone system and an updated pulpit. David said he would table that until finances improved.

To get a campership please register for Camp Nebowa through our church office. Contact Nancy Monday—Friday between 9 a.m.—2 p.m.

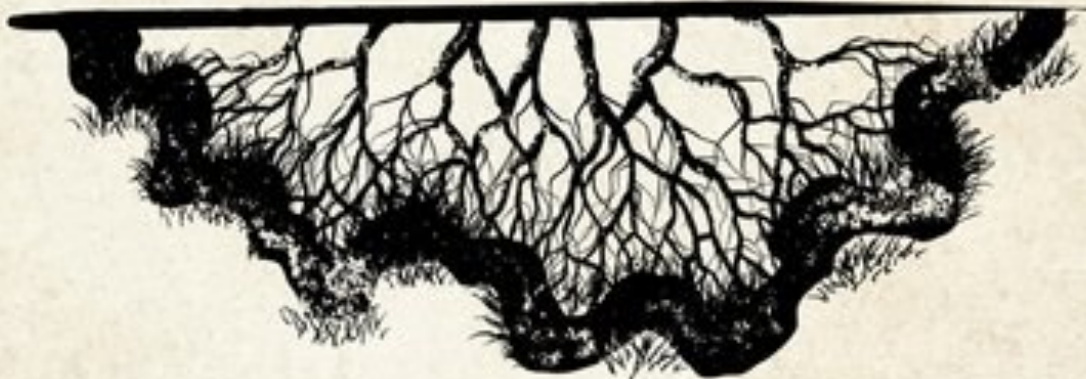
