
Confirmation

TRUSTEE NOTES 1st Quarter 2024

The Trustees recently met to establish the facility needs that need to be addressed in 2024. We have listed them below, along with the funding source. It is important that the congregation know that there are no funds required of the 2024 Suncrest UMC Operating Budget, which primarily comes from your gifts. The projects are not listed in priority order.

- **New HVAC system:** Work is nearly completed, with final installation expected by April. Funding is from the proceeds of the Trinity property sale.
- **New sanctuary lighting:** The installation is complete with the exception of a minor problem with the LED lights behind the cross. Funding came from a federal ERC grant.
- **New sanctuary emergency exit:** Bids are expected in the next two weeks, with work to start in the spring. Funding is from the ERC grant.
- **New sanctuary-level restrooms:** Initial architect drawings are being evaluated. The new women's restroom will be relocated to the old nursing office area, which will allow us to combine the existing men's and women's restrooms to create a new men's restroom. Our goal is to complete this badly needed project by the end of summer. Funding is from the ERC grant.
- **Replacement of the concrete pad/steps and new railing for the exit from the sanctuary to Van Voorhis Road (the original entrance to the church):** This project is required because the concrete has deteriorated and will become a safety issue. We will seek bids in late spring; the goal is to complete the project in 2024. Funding will come from the ERC grant and memorial funds.
- **Replacement of the steps and deck at Old Drummond:** We will remove the deck and replace the steps and ramp with new concrete/block steps and a handicap ramp. There safety issues with the flooring of the deck and steps plus the pavilion allows us to eliminate the deck. We plan the undertake this project over the summer. Funding will come from memorial funds.
- **Addition of speed humps:** Vehicles are speeding through the parking lot, using it as a shortcut to avoid the traffic light. This creates a major safety hazard for everyone, especially for childcare kids, who walk the parking lot to the church entrance or from the playground to the childcare entrance. We are studying the best options with plans to install them before summer. We will also add new low-growing landscaping in the circle in front of the main entrance to improve visibility from the either direc-

tion. Unfortunately, this will require removing the existing pine trees in the circle. Funding will come from the football parking fund.

- **Installation of steeple lights:** New lights will be installed to light up the steeple. Plans include a timer to turn them off at midnight. We will also install a new floodlight near the roof overlooking the childcare entrance sidewalks and the sanctuary entrance/exit facing Van Voorhis Road. Funding will come from the Trustee discretionary account, which includes revenues from the leasing of spaces in the parking lot during the week.
- **Construction of a site to display Suncrest's historic bells:** The bells from Trinity UMC and the Star City UMC have been in storage since the formation of Suncrest UMC. The Trustees want to display these bells in an enclosure to be built near the main entrance to the church. It will include an informational plaque telling the history of the bells. We are presently studying the architect's proposal. Work would be done over the summer. Funding will come from the Trustee's discretionary account.
- **Pressure washing the main building and Old Drummond:** The Trustees have entered into a contract to have both buildings and sidewalks pressure washed this spring. Funding will come from the Trustee's discretionary account.
- **Holding a church-wide clean-up day:** The Trustees will be sponsoring a church-wide cleanup on a Saturday in late April or early May from 9 am to noon. We will undertake a deep cleaning of the church, including discarding of materials and furniture in storage closets and storage rooms that are no longer needed. We will rent an additional dumpster for the day. Lunch will be provided for everyone. More information to follow.
- **Sealing the parking lot by the pavilion:** The Trustees have contracted to have the parking lot nearest the pavilion sealed and striped this summer. This process helps to prolong the life of the lot. Funding will come from football parking revenues.

We conclude this report by thanking Jerry Buckland and David Watkins for their past service on the Trustees and welcoming Mark Cottrill and Jim Collins as our newest Trustees. The returning Trustees are Jim Harris (secretary), Rachel Kitzmiller, Elaine Dougherty (treasurer), Jeff Stenger, April Messerly, and Judy Lightner.

As you might expect, the Trustees have a number of other maintenance and facility issues and concerns, including moving to a paperless records storage system, addressing additional storage issues, repair of the playground fence, enhancing the Narthex as a welcoming center to guests, and more. We felt it important that you be informed of our facility plans for 2024. We, as a church, are blessed with having revenue streams beyond the traditional giving by the congregation to enhance, expand, and maintain our facilities.

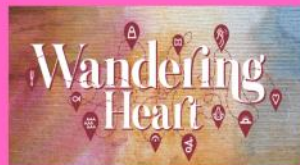

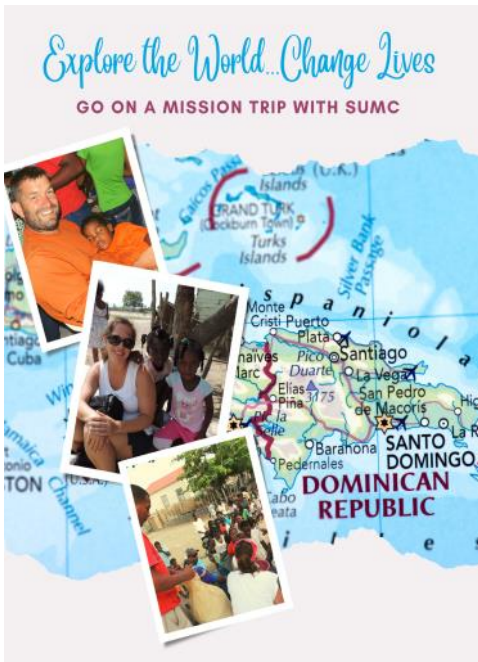

March Health Awareness: Colorectal Cancer

Colorectal Cancer is the second leading cause of cancer-related deaths worldwide.

What is Colorectal Cancer?

Colorectal cancer is also called colon cancer. Colon cancer occurs when there is abnormal growth of cells in the colon. These abnormal growths are called polyps. Over a period of time, polyps can turn into cancer.

Lifestyle Risk Factors:

- Physical inactivity
- A diet low in fiber and high in fat
- A diet consisting of few fruits and vegetables
- A diet high in processed meats
- Being overweight or obese
- Alcohol and/or tobacco use

Other Risk Factors:

- Colorectal cancer risk increases as you get older
- Family history of colon cancer or polyps
- Genetic syndromes, including Lynch syndrome or familial adenomatous polyposis (FAP)

The faith community nursing department at SUMC is expanding and evolving to align with statewide initiatives for promoting faith community locations as access to care points for rural community members.
