

April Is Stress Awareness and Move More Month

Featuring National Walking Day, April 5th

Research recommends walking at an active pace for a minimum of 150 minutes a week.

Reasons Why Walking is the Most Popular Form of Exercise:

- Walking can reduce risk of certain life-threatening diseases, such as heart disease, stroke, diabetes, and multiple different cancers.
- Walking can improve your blood pressure, blood sugar, and blood cholesterol levels.
- Walking is shown to promote your emotional and mental wellbeing and decrease the risk of depression.
- Walking is known to improve memory and decrease the risk of dementia.
- Walking decreases the risk of osteoporosis by strengthening bones.
- Walking can prevent weight gain.
- Walking improves cognitive function and sleep.


Tips to Hit 150-Minute-Walking Goal:

150 minutes a week is a little over 20 minutes per day. You can split 20 minutes up into four 5-minute walking sessions in between work, etc.

How to Be More Active During the Workday:

- Alternate sitting with standing
- Take active breaks from computer
- Walking
- Perform circuit exercises (more on these next week)

Ovcharenko Family News!



Adrii, Oksana, and Ruvym

In April 2023, the Ovcharenko family began their new life in the United States after fleeing the war in their home country of Ukraine. Over the past year, Andrii, Oksana, and Ruvym have settled into daily life in Morgantown. Andrii currently works for Lytle Construction Company, Oksana is employed by the Suncrest Early Learning Center, and Ruvym is thriving as a second grader at North Elementary School.

The family has begun the process of making Morgantown their permanent home, and Andrii and Oksana are working with an immigration attorney to apply for asylum in the U.S. once their two-year parole status expires. Once asylum is granted, they will be permitted to stay in the country indefinitely.

Earlier his month, Andrii's older brother Alex, his wife Natalia, her mother Julia, and their 3-year-old son Mark also arrived in Morgantown from Lithuania where they were living after leaving Ukraine. The family is being sponsored by Harner Chapel UMC. Unfortunately, the benefits that were offered to Andrii and Oksana when they arrived, such as SNAP and Medicaid, are no longer offered by the U.S. government for Ukrainian war refugees.

Because it will be 2 to 3 months before Alex and Natalia can receive their work permits, we are gratefully accepting gift cards in the church


