The Epaphroditus Effect Philippians 2:25-30

The Apostle Paul gives us yet another example of sound Christian Character and Service in the man Epaphroditus. Epaphroditus was sent to Rome to deliver a gift to Paul from the church in Philippi. While he successfully made the trip, he falls very ill and must return home without completing everything he set out to accomplish. Paul sends him home with many praises.
