Sermon Summary

The Life in Union with Christ (1 Corinthians 6:12-20)

Summary – Our union with Christ assures us of our freedom from sin, death and condemnation, and leads us to live as the temple of God in the world.

Union with Christ

God created man and woman in equality, giving them the image of God (Gen. 1:27). Then God brought them into mutuality; "they become one flesh" (Gen. 2:24). "Becoming one flesh" symbolizes equality and mutuality between human beings. This union is broken down after human beings sinned against God; "You will desire your husband, but he will rule over you" (Gen. 3:16). The mutual relationship between two human beings, man and woman, is changed to a hierarchical relationship, the relationship dominated by power, the relationship between the oppressor and the oppressed.

Paul uses the creation story to criticize sexual immorality (1 Cor. 6:16). In Corinthian society, people use their power of money to buy prostitutes, and in the temple of pagan deities, there is a practice of prostitution. This lifestyle is against God's creation: sexual relationships should bring the partners into union. Buying sex or abusing a sexual relationship by power is against God's law of creation to bring human beings into mutuality and equality.

Paul also gives a warning to the Corinthian Christians about the sexual immorality from the viewpoint of our union with Christ; we are in union with Christ in our whole person, in body and soul (1 Cor. 6:14-15). We share in Christ's death and resurrection. We are in union with Christ. Our union with Christ is not only about our spirits but also our bodies. For this reason, we do not have to abuse our possessions, our power, our money,

our privilege, for a sexual relationship. Our abuse of power and our sexual immorality are a violation of our union with Christ.

Two Benefits from Our Union with Christ – Freedom and Holiness

Freedom: Our union with Christ gives us freedom; Paul repeatedly says, "I have freedom to do anything" (1 Cor. 6:12). The Corinthian church has many serious problems, sexual immorality (1 Cor. 5 & 6), leadership conflict or group rivalry (1 Cor. 1:10-17), and lawsuit between the church members (1 Cor. 6:1-8). The life of Corinthian Christians breaks down the biblical principle of mutuality, living together as the body of Christ. However, Paul confirm them of the freedom they have in Christ (1 Cor. 6:11). Despite many problems, they are the holy people of God (1 Cor. 1:2). No one will condemn them to death and take the resurrection life of Christ out of their hands because they are united with Christ, becoming one flesh with him. This is our freedom and our privilege in Christ.

Holiness: Our union with Christ commands us to live in holiness. We were already made "holy to God" and "right with God" not because of our works but because of our union with Christ (1 Cor. 6:11). For this reason, we must live in union with Christ, living in holiness and love, imitating him (1 Cor. 6:19-20). This is the conclusion of Paul's argument in 1 Cor. 6:12-20. Our Christian freedom should be fruitful to make us grow in holiness. This is the reason why God purchased us by paying the price of Christ on the cross and gave us freedom from our sin and its outcome, death. God gives us freedom to stay as God's holy temple in the world. This is God's purpose to give us freedom; We were made holy to God, so that we must live in holiness. What is the life of holiness? It is living in mutuality. We are called to use all God's blessings on us to edify one another, building up mutual relationships with each other and God's church in unity. We will prove that we are the temple of the Holy Spirit on earth by life in mutuality.
