Sermon Summary

The Blessed Life in the Son of God (3): Prayer - Psalm 2

Summary: The decree of the Lord is to make David the Son of God and to give him the nations as his inheritance. This decree has been achieved in Christ, through whose prayer it has become true.

1. God's decree is redemptive-historical

Von Rad, the Old Testament theologian, defines God's decree to David as historical because it opens a new era of God's salvation for humankind. Through the Davidic king, God will bring salvation to all nations and establish his kingship on earth. The God of David is the same God who created human beings in the image of God and commanded them to "be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over" all creatures on earth" (Gen. 1:27-28). The God who called David to become his Son is the same God who called Abraham out of his homeland to make him a blessing to all humankind (Gen 12:2-3). The vision of God's kingdom for all nations has become real through Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is historical and Christ-centered.

Genesis 12:1-3 The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

Psalm 2:7-8 I will proclaim the Lord's decree: He said to me, "You are my son; today I have become your father. Ask me, and I will make the nations your inheritance, the ends of the earth your possession."

Revelation 7:9-10 After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb."

2. How can David and his descendants achieve God's decree to make all the nations their inheritance? The answer is "Ask!"

The Davidic king is by birth and by promise the Son of God. What God will do through David and his offspring is to give them all nations as an inheritance. God the Father will deliver his kingship to his Son so that his Son will rule the people living in the whole world, and his kingship will be extended to the ends of the earth. It is the confirmation of the covenant God made with David and his offspring, his house: "I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me" (2 Sam. 7:12-14).

The God of David is the same God who created human beings in the image of God and commanded them to "be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over" all creatures on earth" (Gen. 1:27-28). The God who called David to become his Son is the same God who called Abraham out of his homeland to make him a blessing to all humankind (Gen 12:2-3). Von Rad, the Old Testament theologian, defines God's decree to David as historical because it opens a new era of God's salvation for humankind. Through the Davidic king, God will bring salvation to all nations and establish his kingship on earth.

In Ps. 2:8, God commands David to ask of him so that God may "make the nations" his heritage and "the ends of the earth" his possession. Praying to God is the precondition to make God's decree come true. Without prayer, a Davidic king cannot fulfill God's decree, functioning to be a blessing to all nations.

3. How did Christ achieve God's promise to David and his offspring? The answer is prayer.

Heb. 5:7 summarizes how Jesus took care of his ministry: "In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission."

Christ achieved God's promise to David through his prayer. Christ fulfilled his role as the Son of God through prayers. In his earthly life, his prayer always preceded his ministry. When he "was praying" after being baptized, "the

heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit came upon him from heaven, and the voice of God, 'You are my Son, the Beloved,' came from heaven" (Luke 3:21-22). Before he chose twelve of his disciples, "he spent the night in prayer to God" (Luke 9:12). When he was praying on the mountain, his appearance changed, and his hidden glory as the Son of God was revealed (Luke 9:28-29). His disciples were very impressed by his prayer life and asked him how to pray, so he taught them the Lord's Prayer (Luke 11:1-5). When he entered the temple, he "drove out those who were selling there," saying, "My house shall be a house of prayer" (Luke 19:45). He prepared himself for "the time of trial," that is, crucifixion, by prayer in Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-40). Even on the cross, he prayed to God to forgive those who put him on the cross and mocked him (Luke 23:34). Jesus took his ministry as the Son of God by prayer. Heb. 5:7 summarizes how he took care of his ministry: "In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission." Our prayer is an expression of our submission to God. In our prayer, God will show his power of salvation. God will work through our prayers. God will let his kingdom come upon us when we pray. God knows our weakness and fragility. But when we pray, the Holy Spirit will empower us to overcome our weakness and the vanity of this world.

Jesus is the Son of God. He is the exact reflection of God's image and power. However, he fulfilled his ministry as the Son of God through his prayer.

4. We must live a life of prayer.

In Christ, we are adopted to be the children of God and his possession. We are the adopted children of God. In Christ, God's steadfast love will never fail. We will never lose hope for "receiving mercy and finding grace" from God; what we need to do is that, whenever we need God's forgiveness and help, God's providence, we must get access "to the throne of grace with boldness" (Heb. 4:16).

Our prayer is our submission to God. In our prayer, God will show his power of salvation. God will work through our prayers. God will let his kingdom come upon us when we pray. God knows our weakness and fragility. But when we pray, the Holy Spirit will empower us to overcome our weakness and the vanity of this world.

The subject matter of the Lord's Prayer is "Thy Kingdom Come." God will work through our prayers and let his kingdom come upon the earth. God knows our weakness and fragility. But when we pray, the Holy Spirit will empower us to overcome our weakness and our desire for the vanity of this world. We see the creation groaning under the pressure of sin and injustice; "the creation was subjected to futility," waiting "with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God" to be "set free from its bondage to decay" (Rom. 8:18-21). We are still "groaning inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies" (Rom. 8:23). What can we do for the creation today? We can pray with patience (Rom. 8:24). The Holy Spirit within us is the Spirit of prayer; he intercedes for us according to God's will (Rom. 8:27). Through our prayer, we will see God's love, justice, and glory made real to the world.
