Sermon Summary

The Church in Pergamum with Compromised Life (Revelation 2:12-17)

Summary: Jesus, the Word of God, demands the Christians in Pergamum to show their faithfulness to his word without compromising with the world, promising them eternal life and immortal glory in his kingdom.

2:12 To the angel of the church in Pergamum write: There are the words of him who has the sharp, double-edged sword.

Christ rules his church and the world by his words, which is the sharp, double-edged sword. His kingdom is built on his word, and the increase of his word is identical with the increase of his kingdom. Jesus' speech has the power to reveal the truths of life, our sins and evil doings, and transform us to the image of God. Telling the words of Jesus is the way to transform the church and the world.

Hebrews 4:12-13. For the Word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit; joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account.

The Word of God has the power to reveal "the thoughts and attitudes of the heart" in every human being (Heb. 4:12). So, "nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight" (Heb. 4:13). Every human being should give account of their speech and actions before God. God is the Creator and the Warrior, who rules his creation by his words. He is the Lord of all; everyone must give account to him.

Jesus is the Judge for all, who is ruling the church and the whole world with his word: His rule is extended to the end of the earth. There is no compromise in his ruling with the Word of God, and every Christian should be faithful to his word. Antipas, the faithful witness, was killed, as Jesus was crucified. His martyrdom is the imitation of Jesus' crucifixion, through which Jesus defeated the evil power, and which led him to the resurrection from the dead. He will return to manifest his rule over the creation. He will judge the world by his words. The Word of God is double-edged: It leads us to martyrdom and resurrection, which are the signs to be victorious over the world. It will bring the faithful to salvation and the unfaithful to judgment. It shows God's grace and mercy and God's wrath against sin and evil. Jesus as the Servant of God is the Savior and the Judge for all. He rules the world with his faithfulness to the Word of God, which has been incarnated into his suffering and glory, his crucifixion and resurrection, and because of which God made him the ruler over all nations.

Rev. 2:13 I know where you live—where Satan has his throne. Yet you remain true to my name. You did not renounce your faith in me, not even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness, who was put to death in your city—where Satan lives.

Pergamum is the provincial capital of Roman Asia, the place for emperor cult, "where Satan has his throne." In other words, it is the provincial capital of Satanic rule. In this city, Christians have persistently kept their faith in Christ. In public, they did not deny their faith, even seeing Antipas, their fellow Christian and leader, killed because of his faithful witness to Christ.

It is the victory of God's kingdom to testify to the gospel of Christ despite persecution, even to the point of death, for his name's sake. It is the war for the kingdom of God, in which the weapon is the words of God fulfilled in Christ Jesus, through his faithfulness to God. Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament, which is the written testimony of the Word of God spoken through his prophets, through his crucifixion and resurrection. His crucifixion was not a defeat of the Word of God but its victory over all evil and sinful power in the world.

The Word of God is so powerful to call the Christians in Pergamum to the kingdom of God in Christ out of the kingdom of Satan represented by the Roman emperor and his cultic religion. The Word of God made them live in faithfulness to Christ and disobedience to the emperor and his rule representing the Satanic power. They shared the faith of Antipas, the martyr, who was murdered because of his faithfulness to Christ, his words.

2:14-15 The enemy of the church is outside and inside of it. Christians overcome the enemy outside but fail to fight against the enemy inside, which is in the false form of Christian religion.

2:14 Nevertheless, I have a few things against you: There are some among you who hold to the teaching of Balaam who taught Balak to entice the Israelites to sin so that they ate food sacrificed to idols and committed sexual immorality.

Jesus recognizes the church as one body. Despite the faithfulness of the Christians in Pergamum, imitating Antipas, the martyr, whom Jesus calls the faithful witness, there are a few things which are very harmful and even destructive to the community of Christ, for which Jesus reproves them.

These things are idolatry and sexual immorality: Some Christians tolerate the emperor-worship by eating the food sacrificed to the idols and the sexual immorality violating the purity and holiness of the church as the body of Christ, which he purchased by his blood on the cross. Idolatry and sexual immorality are the adultery of the Christian community against Jesus Christ, the Bridegroom.

2:15 Likewise, you also have those who hold the teaching of the Nicolaitans. Balaam, in agreement with Balak, who requested him to curse the Israelites, enticed the people of Israel to the sacrifices to idols and sexual immorality. The Nicolaitans instigated Christians to worship the Roman emperor and to commit sexual immorality.

In the church at Pergamum, spiritual adultery (Idolatry) and sexual immorality are combined. Satan is oppressive and deceptive: the oppressor and the deceiver.

2:16 Repent therefore! Otherwise, I will soon come to you and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.

The Christians in Pergamum should repent their sexual immorality and idolatry. Repentance means turning back to Christ and living in obedience to him. The purpose of God's call in Christ is to live in faithfulness to God even to the point of death. It will bring us to the engagement in fighting against the world and its sinful structure. Through our faithfulness to him, God will show his mercy to us and the world and transform us and the world to his image. God's kingdom will come to us and the world.

The Word of God is living, sharp, and transformative. Our unfaithfulness to God will result in our dying out as the community of Christ.

No church will survive with the denial of the Word of God. The Word of God is the manna from heaven.

2:17 Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give some of the hidden manna. I will give that person a white stone with a new name written on it, known only to the one who receives it.

- 1. The renewal of the church begins with the Word of God, through which the Holy Spirit speaks to the churches. The spiritual transformation is according to the Word of God.
- 2. The disciples of Christ have the ears to hear the voice of Christ spoken by the Spirit. Their mi9nds and hearts are not dead but alive, so they will hear the teachings of Christ and his instructions through the Spirit.
- 3. The disciples will obey the Word of God spoken to their hearts through the Spirit. Consequently, they will be victorious through the Word of God, the words of Jesus Christ, who has the sharp, double-edged sword" (2:12).
- 4. As God provided manna for the Israelites in the wilderness, Jesus will provide the hidden manna, the spiritual food, for the Christians in suffering, persecution, and faithfulness to him, and the eternal life in his kingdom.
- 5. These Christians will receive the new names written on the white stone. The new names will be known only to those who receive them.
- 6. The kingdom of God is hidden treasure for the disciples, who use all their possessions, gifts, and glory for the kingdom of God.

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. Amen.
