Sermon Summary

The Blessed Life in the Son of God (2) - Psalm 2

Summary: The decree of the Lord to make David the Son of God and to give him the nations as his inheritance has been achieved in Christ, through his sinless life and his prayer.

- 1. The Kingdom of God for All Nations—God's purpose to call David "my Son": "You are my Son; today I have become your Father (today I have begotten you)." (Ps. 2:7)
- a. The Davidic kingship by God's promise: The Davidic king is the Son of God by birth and by promise. What God will do through David and his offspring is to give them all nations as an inheritance. God the Father will deliver his kingship to his Son so that his Son will rule the people living in the whole world, and his kingship will be extended to the ends of the earth. It is the confirmation of the covenant God made with David and his offspring, his house: "I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me" (2 Sam. 7:12-14).
- b. The Davidic kingdom for all nations: The wisdom and blessing of God are not only for Israel but also for all the kings and rulers of the earth. These teachings are for every nation. What is wisdom for all of us? It is to "serve the LORD with fear and rejoice with trembling" (Ps. 2:11). In Proverbs 1:7, "the fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge." What is more, in Psalm 2, those who live in the fear of the LORD are those who "kiss the Son," so that they will be saved from God's wrath and judgment (Ps. 2:12). The conclusion of Psalm 2 is that the blessed are "all who take refuge in" the Son of God (Ps. 2:12).
- c. The Davidic kingship according to God's salvation history: The God of David is the same God who created human beings in the image of God and commanded them to "be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over" all creatures on earth (Gen. 1:27-28). The God who called David to become his Son is the same God who called Abraham out of his

homeland to make him a blessing to all humankind (Gen 12:2-3). Through the Davidic king, God will bring salvation to all nations and establish his kingship on earth.

2. The Failure of the Davidic Kingship

However, the dynasty of David was unfaithful to God, the Lord, and was punished. The Davidic king failed to represent God's kingship on earth and to be a blessing to all humankind. David and his offspring were called the Son of God. God said to David, "When he commits iniquity, I will punish him with a rod such as mortals use, with blows inflicted by human beings" (2 Sam. 7:14). Because of the sinful nature of David and his offspring and their unfaithfulness to God, his decrees and promise could not come true through them.

3. God's Steadfast Love through Jesus Christ, the Son of God

God's steadfast love for David and his offspring is manifested in Christ Jesus, the Son of God. God called him, "as he came up from the water" after being baptized at the Jordan River, "My Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased" (Mt. 3:16-17). The writer of Hebrew also testifies to the relationship of Jesus Christ with God by quoting Ps. 2:7, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you" (Heb. 1:5). God appointed him "heir of all things" (Heb. 1:2). God the Father inherited everything in the world to Christ, the Son of God. God's promise to David about the establishment of his kingship has been fulfilled through Christ, the Son of God.

"The Father loves the Son and has placed all things in his hands (John 3:35), so that "whoever believes in the Son has the eternal life," being redeemed from their sins and God's wrath to come (3:36). In Psalm 1 those who are delighted with the Word of God are blessed, and in Psalm 2 those who listen to Christ, the Son of God, through whom God speaks to us today, are blessed; they "follow him because they know his voice" (John 10:4).

4. How Jesus achieved God's promise through Davidic kingship: How we should live as the children of God

First, Jesus has no sin. Even though he is the same as God, the exact representation of the image of God, "he himself is subject to" our human

weakness and "in every aspect has been tested as we are, yet without sin," so that he becomes "a great high priest" for us, in whom our sins are washed out (Heb. 4:15, 5:2). Even to the point of death on the cross, Christ was obedient to God and "made perfect" to become "the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him" (Heb. 5:8-9). In Christ we will never lose our hope of "receiving mercy and finding grace" from God; what we need to do is that, whenever we need God's forgiveness and help, God's providence, we are encouraged to get access "to the throne of grace with boldness" (Heb. 4:16). We are God's new creation in Christ, in whom we have the assurance of God's love, from which there is nothing to separate us (Rom. 8:39).

Second, Christ achieved God's promise to David through his prayers. In Ps. 2:8, God commands David to ask of him so that God may "make the nations" his heritage and "the ends of the earth" his possession. Christ fulfilled his role as the Son of God through prayers. In his earthly life, his prayer always preceded his ministry. When he "was praying" after being baptized, "the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit came upon him from heaven, and the voice of God, 'You are my Son, the Beloved,' came from heaven" (Luke 3:21-22). Heb. 5:7 summarizes how he took care of his ministry: "In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission." Our prayer is an expression of our submission to God. In our prayers, God will show his power of salvation. God will work through our prayers. God will let his kingdom come upon us when we pray. God knows our weakness and fragility. But when we pray, the Holy Spirit will empower us to overcome our weakness and the vanity of this world.
