Responsibilities and Rewards Many of Jesus' parables about his coming kingdom revolve around a returning master who portions out rewards and to his awaiting servants. Let's read Luke 19:11–27 and Matthew 25:14–30.
This is the picture that the New Testament has in mind when it speaks of the believer's heavenly "" What have you heard or thought about these?
As we have already seen, Jesus wants to assign a variety of ruling responsibilities in his Kingdom to his believing people. While we all gain entrance into his Kingdom by alone, these rewards and responsibilities differ according to (Luke 14:11; Luke 16:10; 2 Corinthians 5:10, etc).
Responsibility here on the present earth under the curse involves stress and struggle; on the new earth, we will "enter into the of our master (Matt 25:23)."
Jesus often uses the promised rewards of the coming kingdom asfor faithfulness now (see especially Matthew 5–6).
