

The season of Lent in the Church year is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday before Easter Sunday. "Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts, and then became a time for penance by all Christians. The first Sunday of Lent remembers Jesus' temptation by Satan; and Jerusalem and his subsequent passion and death. Because Sundays are always little Easters, the penitential spirit surrounding the 40 days of Lent should be tempered with the joyful expectation of the Resurrection. Traditionally, the ashes used in the service are from burning the previous year's Palm Sunday branches.
