Romans 5:1–5

Key Truth (Romans 5:1–2)

Because we are justified by faith, we now have:

1. Peace with God

Our sin no longer separates us from Him.

2. Access into Grace

Through Jesus, we are welcomed into God's favor and presence.

3. Hope of God's Glory

We have a confident future with God.

What Does It Mean to “Stand in Grace”?

Grace is not just a one-time gift of forgiveness.

It is a **new position** and **new way of living**.

In this grace we have:

- Acceptance
- Forgiveness
- Relationship with God
- Security
- Daily help and strength

We do not visit grace occasionally.

We live in it.

The Growth Chain (Romans 5:3–5)

God does not waste suffering.

He uses it to grow our faith.

Step 1: Suffering

Trials, pressures, hardships, and difficulties.

Step 2: Endurance

The strength to remain faithful and not give up.

Step 3: Proven Character

Faith that has been tested and refined.

Step 4: Hope

A deeper, stronger confidence in God's promises.

Step 5: Assurance

“The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit.”

Big Idea

Because we are justified by faith:

- Our **past** is forgiven.
- Our **present** is secure in grace.
- Our **future** is filled with hope.

Even our sufferings have purpose.

They are part of God's process to build endurance, character, and unshakable hope.
