

## SECOND READING: James 3:1-12


<sup>1</sup>Let not many of you become teachers, my brethren, for you know that we who teach shall be judged with greater strictness. <sup>2</sup> For we all make many mistakes, and if any one makes no mistakes in what he says he is a perfect man, able to bridle the whole body also. <sup>3</sup> If we put bits into the mouths of horses that they may obey us, we guide their whole bodies. <sup>4</sup> Look at the ships also; though they are so great and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. <sup>5</sup> So the tongue is a little member and boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! <sup>6</sup> And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is an unrighteous world among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the cycle of nature, and set on fire by hell. <sup>7</sup> For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by humankind, <sup>8</sup> but no human being can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. <sup>9</sup> With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who are made in the likeness of God. <sup>10</sup> From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brethren, this ought not to be so. <sup>11</sup> Does a spring pour forth from the same opening fresh water and brackish? <sup>12</sup> Can a fig tree, my brethren, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.






