

There is no other rock; I know not one.

# PSALM: Psalm 86:11-17 (Read Responsively)

<sup>11</sup>Teach me your way, O Lord, that I may walk in your truth; give me an undivided heart to revere your name. <sup>12</sup> I give thanks to you, O Lord my God, with my whole heart, and I will glorify your name forever. <sup>13</sup> For great is your steadfast love toward me; you have delivered my soul from the depths of Sheol. <sup>14</sup> O God, the insolent rise up against me; a band of ruffians seeks my life, and they do not set you before them. <sup>15</sup> But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. <sup>16</sup> Turn to me and be gracious to me; give your strength to your servant; save the child of your maidservant. <sup>17</sup> Show me a sign of your favor, so that those who hate me may see it and be put to shame, because you, Lord, have helped me and comforted me.

# SECOND READING: Romans 8:12-25 (Sunday 9:00 a.m.)

<sup>12</sup> So then, brothers and sisters, we are obligated, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—<sup>13</sup> for if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup> For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. <sup>15</sup> For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" <sup>16</sup> it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, <sup>17</sup> and if children, then heirs: heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if we in fact suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

<sup>18</sup> I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. <sup>19</sup> For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God, <sup>20</sup> for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup> that the creation itself will be set free from its enslavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup> We know that the whole creation has been groaning together as it suffers together the pains of labor, <sup>23</sup> and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. <sup>24</sup> For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees? <sup>25</sup> But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.






