Our focus will be on those folks in our community who do not have adequate shelter or are in a dangerous situation in their home. We are looking to partner with many churches in the area as well, and as I mentioned about Titus 2, watch for some more detail about this. But, you can always learn more at our showcase and if you are interested, we'd love to have you involved.

As we swing into the months of autumn, let's remember that a healthy church is one who worships together in Spirit and Truth and also one who works together to advance the mission of our Lord. We are called to serve one another in love and reach the lost. Our job is to bear witness to the risen Lord and to share the Gospel of grace as part of the Great Commission. The question for you is, "how will you help serve in this way?"

I look forward to being a part of the work the Lord is doing here in Bentheim and I look forward to worshipping and working alongside of you!


