From the Pastor's Desk

Last month, the newsletter's book-of-the-month recommendation focused on three different devotions. The reason why is, as I mentioned, the elders have been talking quite a bit about how we can encourage the congregation to devote time each day to be in the Word as a family. Devotionals can be great way to help families commit themselves to reading the Bible.

Well, as a follow up to this, I thought I would include in this month's newsletter one of the devotions that I read in the month of December, Come to the Waters. I found it to be a great help of explaining how important it is to read the Bible daily BUT also offering some advice as to how to read the Bible. For many of you, this will be a good reminder for the new year, but for others, it may be a new concept when we think about how to read the Bible..... In some ways it sounds strange to think about different ways to read God's Word but there are different methods we need to consider. So, take a look at this short devotional and if you have any questions, I am happy to talk with you!

Studying the Word of God Psalm 119:161-76

My soul keeps your testimonies; I love them exceedingly. Psalm 119:167

Study of the Bible must be the consuming passion of a believer's life. This is because it is only by the study of the Word of God that we learn what it is to obey God and follow Jesus. If you want to know God as he speaks to you through the Bible, you should do the following.

- 1.Study the Bible daily. We should discipline our lives to include regular periods of Bible study, just as we discipline ourselves to have regular periods for sleep, eating our meals, and so on. These things are necessary if the body is to be healthy and if good work is to be done. In the same way, we must feed regularly on God's Word if we are to become and remain spiritually strong.
- 2.Study the Bible systematically. The best system is a regular, disciplined study of certain books of the Bible as a whole. The psalmist did this. The proof is the great variety of terms he uses for the Scriptures. As he saw it, the Bible embraces the law, statutes, ways, precepts, decrees, commands, words, and promises of God. He did not want to neglect even one of them.
- 3.Study the Bible comprehensively. There should be an attempt to become acquainted with the Bible as a whole. This means reading it comprehensively. Paul told Timothy, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Tim. 3:16).
- 4. Study the Bible devotionally. Nothing is clearer in this psalm than the close, indissoluble link between knowledge of God and study of the Word of God, between loving God and loving the Bible. In reading the Bible, we study to know God, hear his voice, and be changed by him as we grow in holiness. Furthermore, we must memorize important sections of Scripture. As Christians we need to allow the Word of God to become a part of us. To have that happen, we must memorize it.
- 5.Study the Bible prayerfully. The best way to study the Bible is to encompass the study in prayer. Before we begin to read, we should say, "Lord God, I am turning to your Word. I cannot understand it as I should. I need your Holy Spirit to instruct me and draw a proper response from me. What I understand I want to obey. Help me to do that for Jesus's sake." Then we must study the passage, and when we find something that pertains to our lives, we must stop and acknowledge it prayerfully. Without regular, personal Bible study and prayer, we are not really walking with Christ as his followers, and we are certainly not obeying him in specific areas.

The Bentheim, Drenthe, Niekerk, and Oakland churches were truly blessed again this year in raising money for Growing Hope Globally. Even though yields were not as good as we hoped, churches were blessed by businesses, churches, and individuals increased giving. We are able to distribute \$62,400 to Growing Hope Globally. The

following programs have been recommended to be supported:

- 1. Bangladesh Dewanganj (Local leadership, sustainable agriculture and crop diversification): \$2.846.47
- 2. Kenya Igembe (Food security, savings and lending, nutrition, and sanitation): \$10,813.53
- 3. India Dimoria (Increased production and diversity through sustainable agriculture practices): \$8,500.00
- 4. Uganda Rubanda (Conservation agriculture and other soil fertility restoration practices): \$8,500.00
- 5. Zambia Lundazi (Addressing food security and nutrition with a holistic approach): \$8.500.00
- 6. West Africa (Training on gardening, rice production, chicken raising, and nutrition): \$8,500.00
- 7. Cambodia South (Enhancing farm productivity and access to markets): \$8,500.00
- 8. Growing Hope Globally Operations (To help us continue growing lasting solutions to hunger!): \$6,240.00
