He also writes, "Without the spirit of constant prayer, we cannot maintain the gravity and gladness that lingers in the vicinity of the throne of grace."

These words convicted me deeply. I'm not saying to throw out your books (please don't!), but rather to hold prayer and study together—hand in hand. When I began doing this, something shifted. My sermon prep changed, my preaching changed, and I sensed the presence of God in a deeper, more powerful way.


